The Board of County Commissioners met in a regular session on Wednesday, February 11, 2026. Commissioner Smith, Commissioner Dove, Commissioner Culbertson and Commissioner Stieben are present; Commissioner Reid is absent; Also present: Mark Loughry, County Administrator; Misty Brown, County Counselor; Tammy Saldivar, Solid Waste Director; John Jacobson, Planning and Zoning Director; Amy Allison, Planning and Zoning Deputy Director; Fran Keppler, County Clerk

PUBLIC COMMENT:

Heather Reisig, Rebecca Davis, Kevin Grow, Brian Morley, Ted Grinter and Kim Colvert commented.

ADMINISTRATIVE BUSINESS:

Fran Keppler reported the election for USD 469 special bond starts today.

The Board briefly discussed data centers and a future work session.

Commissioner Culbertson recapped the discussions with Fort Leavenworth and EMS services.

A motion was made by Commissioner Culbertson and seconded by Commissioner Smith to accept the consent agenda for Wednesday, February 11, 2026, as presented.

Motion passed, 4-0.

Tammy Saldivar requested the Board to adopt the Leavenworth County 2026 Solid Waste Committee member roster.

A motion was made by Commissioner Smith and seconded by Commissioner Culbertson to adopt and forward the Leavenworth County 2026 Solid Waste Committee member roster to KDHE.

Motion passed, 4-0.

Ms. Saldivar presented a 3-year lease agreement for three backhoes.

A motion was made by Commissioner Culbertson and seconded by Commissioner Smith to accept a 3-year lease agreement from VLP Equipment Share for three Case 580SN backhoes with an annual lease payment in the amount of \$76,405.70.

Motion passed, 4-0.

Amy Allison presented Board Order 2026-1, a right-of-way vacation for Stonegate Court.

Commissioner Stieben opened the public hearing.

No one spoke in favor or opposition of the request.

Commissioner Stieben closed the public hearing.

A motion was made by Commissioner Dove and seconded by Commissioner Smith to find that all proper notice for this vacation has been given, that the right-of-way in question has no use and has not been used as a public road and no future use of this road is foreseen, and that the vacation shall not interfere with, impair, infringe or obstruct the property right of public utilities and easements for public services. Therefore, I move to adopt Board Order 2026-1, approving the proposed right-of-way vacation.

Motion passed, 4-0.

Ms. Allison presented Case DEV-25-146, a preliminary and final plat for Quail Ridge Estates.

A motion was made by Commissioner Smith and seconded by Commissioner Dove that the proposed final plat as outlined in Case DEV-25-146 is compliant with the County Zoning and Subdivision Regulations and move that the proposed final plat be conditionally approved and accepted by this Board subject to the conditions set forth in the staff report and as adopted by the Planning Commission.

Motion passed, 4-0.

A motion was made by Commissioner Culbertson and seconded by Commissioner Smith that the Board recess for a closed executive meeting to consult with our attorneys and discuss confidential matters related to contract negotiations and the legal interest of the County which would be deemed privileged in the attorney-client relationship as permitted under the Kansas Open Meetings Act and that Board resume open meeting at 10:30 a.m. in the meeting room of the Board. Present in the executive meeting will be Commissioners Mike Smith, Jeff Culbertson, Willie Dove, Mike Stieben, County Administrator Mark Loughry and County Counselor Misty Brown.

Motion passed, 4-0.

The Board returned to regular session at 10:30 a.m. No Action was taken and no decisions were made. The subject was limited to the legal interests of the County.

Commissioner Culbertson testified in Topeka on the earnings tax bill.

The Board briefly discussed house bills in legislation.

Commissioner Dove participated in a community engagement presentation from the individuals bringing in the battery plant indicating they will not be using the state incentives because it would not be in the public's interest.

A motion was made by Commissioner Smith and seconded by Commissioner Dove to adjourn.

Action Requested: Approve the Construction Engineering proposal and contract with Atlas Land Consulting for the inspection of bridge replacement projects A-07, HP-51, and T-31.

Analysis: Only one proposal was received for this work consisting of the inspection of the construction of three steel bridges being constructed later this year. We reached out to multiple other firms after the due date to see why they declined to propose on the work. They cited lack of staff and one firm sited their technician forgot to deliver the proposal or had the date wrong. The county has not contracted with Atlas Land Consulting on prior projects. The selection committee discussed whether or not to advertise again and accept the single proposal to keep the projects on schedule. The recommendation is to keep the projects on schedule and provide Atlas the opportunity to demonstrate their abilities. Their staff will act as inspectors for daily observation and Pfefferkorn Engineering staff will complete the materials testing.

AGREEMENT FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES

THIS AGREEMENT made as of _____, 20____, between the County of Leavenworth, Kansas (hereinafter called the "County "), and Atlas Land Consulting, LLC (hereinafter called the "Consultant").

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the Consultant represents that it is duly qualified and licensed civil engineering consultant firm, experienced in KDOT Certified Inspection and Material Testing and related services; and

WHEREAS, in the judgement of the County of Leavenworth, it is necessary and desirable to employ the services of a consultant for said services.

WHEREAS, the Consultant represents that it has sufficient experience and qualified personnel to perform, and the County desires the Consultant to perform, the professional services herein described; and

WHEREAS, the County has determined that, of those who responded to the County's solicitation, the Consultant is the best qualified to provide the professional services described herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, the County and the Consultant, in consideration of the foregoing recitals and the mutual covenants contained herein, agree in respect to the performance of professional services by the Consultant and the payment for those services by the County as set forth below.

ARTICLE I

Scope of Project Work & Construction Engineering Services

The Consultant shall provide for the Construction Engineering Professional services listed in attached Exhibit A: Scope of Work & Services.

ARTICLE II

Compensation

The County shall pay the Consultant for services performed, as outlined in Article I, on an hourly rate. Total compensation for hourly costs and reimbursable expenses shall not exceed the maximum compensation listed in the attached Consultants proposal which includes total compensation limit for inspection services, applicable hourly rates, and material testing unit prices as direct reimbursable expenses. Such hourly rates and material testing fees include salary, benefits, overhead and profit due the Consultant. Consultant agrees to provide County with hour logs for assigned staff on a monthly basis to accompany invoices.

Unless otherwise agreed to all other expenses not listed including local and long-distance telephone, fax, cell phones, printing, reproductions, computer use, photographs, video, software use, postage, delivery, mileage, contract accounting, and miscellaneous shall be included in the hourly labor rates and shall not be billed or reimbursed separately.

At monthly intervals, the Consultant shall submit to the County a certified invoice for allowable costs incurred in the performance of this Agreement during the month. The County shall pay the Consultant for all undisputed work performed by the Consultant within thirty days after receipt of such invoice. Should the County take exception to or dispute any portion of the certified invoice, the County shall communicate the details and nature of the dispute to the Consultant in writing within thirty days after receipt of the invoice.

ARTICLE III

Time

The terms of this agreement shall remain in force until December 31, 2026 unless a time extension is granted or unless terminated earlier in accordance with the provisions of Article VI below.

Solely at the discretion of the County, an extension in time may be granted to the Consultant for delays recognized by the County as unavoidable. Consultant may request extension of time stating fully the reasons for such request. Extensions for unavoidable delays shall be made in writing and submitted to the County for review.

ARTICLE IV

County's Responsibilities

County shall do the following in a timely manner so as not to unreasonably delay the services of the Consultant:

1. Provide all requirements for the project, including construction engineering objectives and constraints, capacity and performance requirements, and budgetary limitations.
2. Furnish reports, plans and surveys in its possession that pertain to the project.
3. Furnish contract documents, plans, and specifications for the project.
4. Review any Consultant's draft submittals.
5. Provide permits required by all applicable regulatory agencies.
6. Attend project progress meetings, preconstruction conferences, and construction meetings.
7. Provide temporary construction, drainage and right-of-way easements necessary to complete the project.
8. Complete the additional responsibilities, if any, listed in Exhibit A: Scope of Work and Services.
9. Identify, in writing, a primary point of contact through whom all communications to the Consultant shall be issued.

ARTICLE V

Consultant's Responsibilities

In addition to the basic services identified in Article I "Exhibit A: Scope of Work & Services" the consultant shall do the following:

1. Comply with local, state and federal rules, regulations and laws pertaining to this Agreement that are applicable at the time the Consultant provides Construction Engineering services. Consultant shall represent it is in good standing and full compliance with the statutes of the State of Kansas for registration of professional engineers, the FWHA and all Federal agencies.
2. Provide only KDOT CIT certified staff to perform all aspects of project material testing and construction inspection to meet KDOT project requirements for federally funded improvements.
3. Indemnify and hold harmless the County, its officers, employees, and agents, from all claims, damages, losses and expenses, including reasonable attorney's fees, arising out of or resulting from the performance of the services, provided that any such claim, damage, loss, or expense is and only to the extent caused by a negligent act, error or omission of the Consultant, its subcontractors, anyone directly or indirectly employed by any of them or anyone for whose acts any of them may be liable.
4. Maintain throughout the duration of this contract insurance in the following amounts that will protect the Consultant and the County from claims set forth below which may arise of out of or result from the Consultant's execution of the Project by Consultant or by any subcontractors or by anyone directly or indirectly employed by Consultant, or by anyone for whose acts Consultant may be liable. The County shall be identified as an "additional named insured" and Consultant will, upon request of the County, furnish copy of certificate of insurance thereof:

(a) Worker's Compensation and Employer's Liability

(b) Comprehensive Automobile Liability

(c) Comprehensive General Liability

Property Damage	\$1,000,000 each occurrence

The Consultant shall maintain Professional Liability Insurance in an amount of \$1,000,000 and provide County with certification thereof upon request.

6. Employ persons qualified to efficiently perform the obligations and duties of the Consultant under this Agreement. If the County shall so direct, the Consultant shall remove from the project any engineer, architect, surveyor, technician, inspector, project manager, geologist, appraiser or other person employed by the Consultant in connection with the work.
7. Consultant will exercise reasonable skill, care, and diligence in the performance of Consultant's services and will carry out its responsibilities in accordance with customarily accepted professional engineering practices. If the Consultant fails to meet the foregoing standard, Consultant will perform at its own cost, and without reimbursement from County, the professional services necessary to correct errors and omissions which are caused by Consultant's failure to comply with above standard, and which are reported to Consultant within one year from the completion of Consultant's services for the Project.
8. All Consultant personnel shall be required at a minimum to wear protective clothing to comply with the high visibility requirements of the MUTCD, Chapter 6E.02, High-Visibility Safety Apparel.

ARTICLE VI

Miscellaneous

1. **Terms Herein Controlling Provisions.** It is expressly agreed that the terms of each and every provision in this attachment shall prevail and control over the terms of any other conflicting provision in any other document relating to and a part of the agreement in which this attachment is incorporated. Any terms that conflict or could be interpreted to conflict with this attachment are nullified.
2. **Governing Law and Venue.** This Agreement is subject to, governed by, and construed according to the laws of the State of Kansas. Jurisdiction and venue of any suit in connection with the Agreement shall reside only in courts located in Leavenworth County, Kansas.
3. **Compliance with Law.** Consultant shall comply with all applicable local, state, and federal laws and regulations in carrying out this Agreement, regardless of whether those legal requirements are specifically referenced in this Agreement.
4. **Modification of Agreement.** This Agreement may be modified or amended only in writing executed by both parties and will be subject to renegotiation in the event of changes to applicable law, rules, or regulations affecting the subject matter of this Agreement.
5. **Assignment.** Neither the Consultant nor the County shall, sell, transfer, assign, or otherwise dispose of any rights or obligations created by this Agreement without the written consent of the other party.

6. **Cash Basis Law.** This Agreement is subject to the Kansas Cash Basis Law, K.S.A. 10-1101 *et seq.* and amendments thereto. Any automatic renewal of the terms of the Agreement shall create no legal obligation on the part of the County. This Agreement shall be construed and interpreted so as to ensure that the County shall at all times stay in conformity with such laws and, as a condition of this Agreement, the County reserves the right to unilaterally sever, modify, or terminate this Agreement at any time if, in the opinion of its legal counsel, the Agreement is deemed to violate the terms of such law. The County is obligated only to pay periodic payments or monthly installments under the Agreement as may lawfully be made from (a) funds budgeted and appropriated for that purpose during the County's current budget year or (b) funds made available from any lawfully operated revenue producing source.
7. **Payment of Taxes.** The County shall not be responsible for, nor indemnify the Consultant for any federal, state, or local taxes which may be imposed or levied upon the subject matter of this Agreement.
8. **Licenses and Permits.** Consultant shall maintain all licenses, permits, certifications, bonds, and insurance required by federal, state, or local authority for carrying out this Agreement. Consultant shall notify the County immediately if any required license, permit, bond, or insurance is cancelled, suspended, or is otherwise ineffective. Such cancellation, suspension, or other ineffectiveness may form the basis for immediate termination by the County in its discretion.
9. **Independent Consultant Relation.** The parties agree that the legal relationship between them is of a contractual nature. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to create a relationship of employer and employee or principal and agent or any other relationship other than that of independent parties contracting with each other solely for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of this Agreement. Nothing in this Agreement shall create any right or remedies in any third party. The parties agree that no persons supplied by the Consultant are employees of the County and that no right of the County's civil service, retirement, or personnel rules accrue to such persons. The County shall not be responsible for withholding of social security, workers compensation insurance, unemployment compensation, bonuses, retirement benefits, other benefits, and any taxes and premiums from any payments made by the County to the Consultant.
10. **Anti-Discrimination Clause:** Consultant agrees: (a) to comply with the Kansas Act Against Discrimination (K.S.A. 44-1001 *et seq.*) and the Kansas Age Discrimination in Employment Act (K.S.A. 44-1111 *et seq.*) and the applicable provisions of the Americans With Disabilities Act (42 U.S.C. 12101 *et seq.*) (ADA), and Kansas Executive Order No. 19-02, and to not discriminate against any person because of race, color, gender, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, religion, national origin, ancestry, age, military or veteran status, disability status, marital or family status, genetic information, or political affiliation that is unrelated to the person's ability to reasonably perform the duties of a particular job or position; (b) to include in all solicitations or advertisements for employees, the phrase "equal opportunity employer"; (c) to comply with the reporting requirements set out at K.S.A. 44-1031 and K.S.A. 44-1116; (d) to include those

provisions in every subcontract or purchase order so that they are binding upon such subcontractor or vendor; (e) that a failure to comply with the reporting requirements of (c) above or if the Consultant is found guilty of any violation of such acts by the Kansas Human Rights Commission, such violation shall constitute a breach of contract and the agreement may be cancelled, terminated or suspended, in whole or in part, by the contracting state agency or the Kansas Department of Administration; (f) if it is determined that the Consultant has violated applicable provisions of ADA, such violation shall constitute a breach of contract and the agreement may be cancelled, terminated or suspended, in whole or in part, by the University or the Kansas Department of Administration.

Consultant agrees to comply with all applicable state and federal anti-discrimination laws.

The provisions of this paragraph number 10 (with the exception of those provisions relating to the ADA) are not applicable to a Consultant who employs fewer than four employees during the term of such contract or whose contracts with the contracting State agency cumulatively total \$5,000 or less during the fiscal year of such agency.

11. **Representative's Authority to Contract.** By signing this contract, the representative of Consultant thereby represents that such person is duly authorized by Consultant to execute this contract on behalf of Consultant and that Consultant agrees to be bound by the provisions thereof.
12. **Waiver of Breach.** The waiver by either party of a breach of any provision of this Agreement will not operate or be construed as a waiver of any subsequent breach by such party.
13. **Severability.** If a court of competent jurisdiction declares any part of this Agreement to be invalid, the balance of the agreement will remain valid and enforceable.
14. **Entire Agreement.** This Agreement and its attachments set forth the parties' entire agreement. Neither party has made any oral or side agreements or representations not contained in this Agreement. This is a legal document and not a mere recital and is binding upon the parties, their representatives, and successors in interest.
15. **Disclaimer of Liability.** The County shall not hold harmless or indemnify the Consultant for any liability whatsoever. No provision of this Agreement will be given effect that attempts to require the County to defend, hold harmless, or indemnify any Consultant or third party for any acts or omissions. The liability of the County is defined under the Kansas Tort Claims Act (K.S.A. 75-6101 et seq.).
16. **Termination for Default.** If the Consultant refuses or fails to perform any of the provisions of this Agreement with such diligence as will ensure its completion within the time specified in this Agreement, or any extension thereof, or commits any other substantial breach of this Agreement, the County may notify the Consultant in writing of the delay or nonperformance and, if not cured in ten days or any longer time specified in

writing by the County, the County may terminate the Consultant's rights to proceed with the Agreement or such part of the Agreement as to which there has been delay or a failure to properly perform.

The County shall pay the Consultant the costs and expenses and reasonable profit for services performed by the Consultant prior to receipt of the notice of termination; however, the County may withhold from amounts due the Consultant such sums as the County deems to be necessary to protect the County against loss caused by the Consultant because of the default.

Except with respect to defaults of subcontractors, the Consultant shall not be in default by reason of any failure in performance of this Agreement in accordance with its terms if the Consultant has notified the County within 15 days of the cause of the delay and the failure arises out of causes such as acts of God, acts of the public enemy, act of the County and any other governmental entity in its sovereign or contractual capacity, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions, strikes, or other labor disputes. If the failure to perform is caused by the failure of a subcontractors to perform or to make progress, and if such failure arises out of causes similar to those set forth above, the Consultant shall not be deemed to be in default, unless the services to be furnished by the subcontractors were reasonably obtainable from other sources in sufficient time to permit the Consultant to meet the contract requirements. Upon request of the Consultant, the County shall ascertain the facts and extent of such failure, and, if such officer determines that any failure to perform was occasioned by any one or more of the excusable causes, and that, but for the excusable cause, the Consultant's progress and performance would have met the terms of the Agreement, the time for completion of the Agreement shall be revised accordingly.

If, after notice of termination of the Consultant's right to proceed under the provisions of this clause, it is determined for any reason that the Consultant was not in default under the provisions of this clause, and both the County and the Consultant agree, the rights and obligations of the parties shall be the same as if the notice of termination had not been issued.

The following acts committed by the Consultant will constitute a substantial breach of the Agreement and may result in termination of the Agreement:

- If the Consultant is adjudged bankrupt or insolvent;
- If the Consultant makes a general assignment for the benefit of his creditors;
- If a trustee or receiver is appointed for the Consultant or any of his property;
- If the Consultant files a petition to take advantage of any debtor's act or to reorganize under bankruptcy or applicable laws;
- If the Consultant repeatedly fails to supply sufficient services;

- If the Consultant disregards the authority of the County;
- Acts other than those specified may constitute substantial breach of this Agreement.

17. **Termination for Convenience.** The County may, when the interests of the County so require, terminate this contract in whole or in part, for the convenience of the County. The County shall give written notice of the termination to the Consultant specifying the part of the contract terminated and when termination becomes effective.

The Consultant shall incur no further obligations in connection with the terminated work and on the date set in the notice of termination the Consultant will stop work to the extent specified. The County shall pay the Consultant the following amounts:

All costs and expenses incurred by the Consultant for work accepted by the County prior to the Consultant's receipt of the notice of termination, plus a reasonable profit for said work.

All costs and expenses incurred by the Consultant for work not yet accepted by the County but performed by the Consultant prior to receipt of the notice of termination, plus a reasonable profit for said work.

Anticipatory profit for work and services not performed by the Consultant shall not be allowed.

18. **Arbitration, Damages and Warranties.** Notwithstanding any language to the contrary, no interpretation of this Agreement shall find that the County has agreed to binding arbitration, or the payment of damages or penalties. Further, the County does not agree to pay attorney fees, costs, or late payment charges beyond those available under the Kansas Prompt Payment Act (K.S.A. 75-6403), and no provision will be given effect that attempts to exclude, modify, disclaim or otherwise attempt to limit any damages available to the County at law, including but not limited to the implied warranties of merchantability and fitness for a particular purpose.
19. **Ownership of Materials.** All property rights, including publication rights, in all interim, draft, and final reports and other documentation, including machine-readable media, produced by the Consultant in connection with the work pursuant to this Agreement, shall be in the County.
20. **Availability of Records and Audit.** The Consultant agrees to maintain books, records, documents, and other evidence pertaining to the costs and expenses of the services provided under the Agreement (hereinafter collectively called "records") to the extent and in such detail as will properly reflect all net costs, direct and indirect, of labor, materials, equipment, supplies, and services, and other costs and expenses of whatever nature for which reimbursement is claimed under the provisions of this Agreement. The Consultant agrees to make available at the offices of the County at all times during the period set forth in the Request for Proposals any of the records for inspection, audit, or reproduction by any authorized representative of the County. Except for documentary evidence

delivered to the offices of the County, the Consultant shall preserve and make available to persons designated by the County his records for a period of five years from the date of final payment under the Agreement or until all audit questions have been resolved, whichever period of time is longer. The Audit Standards set forth in 2 C.F.R. Part 200, "Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards", and specifically the requirements in Subpart F, 2 C.F.R. Section 200.500, et seq. require compliance in accordance with these standards. The Secretary of State and/or the FHWA may request, in their sole discretion, to conduct an audit of the Project.

21. **No Limit of Liability.** Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to limit the Consultant's liability to the County as such liability may exist by or under operation of law.
22. **Indemnification.** Consultant shall indemnify, defend, and hold the County harmless from and against all claims, losses, damages, or costs arising from or in any way related to Consultant's breach of the foregoing warranties. This indemnification shall not be subject to any limitations of remedies or warranties which are contained in this or any other agreement and shall survive termination of this or any other agreement between the parties hereto or thereto.
23. **Authority to Contract.** Consultant represents that it possesses legal authority to contract, that it has undertaken any official action required by its governing documents to enter into this Agreement, that its undersigned representative is duly authorized to execute this document on its behalf, that it agrees to be bound by all the provisions of this Agreement, and that the person identified as its official representative is authorized to act on its behalf in the implementation of this Agreement.

REQUEST FOR 2026 BRIDGE REPLACEMENT CONSTRUCTION ENGINEERING (INSPECTION) SERVICES BRIDGES A-07, HP-51, T-31

A. Introduction

Leavenworth County is seeking proposals from firms qualified to provide construction engineering (inspection and material testing) services for three Bridge Replacement Projects in 2026. The bridge replacement and location is as follows:

Bridge A-07 located on Lecompton Road, 0.2-Mile East of 235th Street
25'-6" wide by 30'-0" long Single Span Steel Girder Precast Concrete Slab
March 23, 2026 Anticipated Start Date, 45 Working Day Construction Period

Bridge HP-51 located on Jamison Road, 0.3-Mile East of 187th Street
30'-6" wide by 60'-0" long Single Span Steel Girder, Cast in Place Deck
June 1, 2026 Anticipated Start Date, 60 Working Day Construction Period

Bridge T-31 located on Fairmount Road, 0.1-Mile East of 219th Street
25'-6" wide by 30'-0" long Single Span Steel Girder Precast Concrete Slab
August 31, 2026 Anticipated Start Date, 45 Working Day Construction Period

All steel girders shall be placed on H-Pile Abutment supports. Abutment and Wing Walls shall utilize Sheet Pile connected to H-Piles for soil retainage. The cast in place bridge deck shall consist of KDOT 6" Concrete Grade 5.0 (AE)(SW) with applicable epoxy coated reinforcing steel to meet HL-93 Loading. No roadway improvements are included in any of the replacement projects. Roadway improvements will be completed by Leavenworth County Public Works staff once the bridge is accepted by the County. The County has selected Norfolk Construction to complete the A-07 project. Contractor's Contract Bid Form and preliminary plans are included in the Request Packet. The remaining two replacement sites are currently under design. No sites shall require KDHE NOI and SWPPP Inspections due to minor disturbed area. A job trailer will not be provided for the project.

Firms are requested to provide price proposal for the total amount of staff hours required for the working days listed for each replacement project, exclusive of any required concrete curing periods of no work. Although the replacement schedule is listed above it is possible that multiple projects may be on-going simultanelously. All work shall be completed in 2026.

B. Scope of Services

The Consultant shall provide a Chief Inspector to perform the services listed below.

1. Site Inspection and Liaison with County and Contractor
 - a. Consult with and advise the County, and act as the County's on-site representative with the Contractor working through the Contractor's superintendent.
 - b. Consult with the County and Contractor, giving opinions and suggestions based on Chief Inspector's observations as an experienced and qualified professional.
 - c. Conduct on-site inspection to assist the County in determination as to whether the

executed work of the Contractor is proceeding in accordance with the Contract

Documents. Report to the County in a timely manner when any work is unsatisfactory, faulty, defective, damaged, or is not in conformance with the Construction Documents or does not meet the requirements of any inspection, test, or approval required to be made.

- d. Monitor changes of apparent integrity of the site. Observe site conditions when the Contractor maintains that differing site conditions have been encountered, and document actual site conditions.
- e. Perform all field tests of materials, structures, and piping. Report test results to the County as appropriate.
- f. Visually inspect materials, equipment, and supplies delivered to the site. Reject materials, equipment, and supplies which do not conform to the Contract Documents with concurrence of the County.
- g. Issue field orders authorizing minor changes in the work which are consistent with the intent of the Contract Documents, and do not involve an adjustment in the contract price or contract time. Field orders shall be documented in writing on forms acceptable to the County.
- h. Inspect the Contractor's work to determine if construction activities are confined to the approved areas indicated in the approved drawings. Activities of the Contractor observed to be beyond the limits of the areas indicated on the approved drawings shall be reported to the Contractor and the County for immediate correction.

2. Meetings, Reports, and Maintenance of Documents

- a. Attend any proposed progress meetings with the County and Contractor to review and discuss construction procedures, progress, scheduling, and other matters concerning the project.
- b. Coordinate County issuance of work change directives to the Contractor as necessary.
- c. Maintain orderly files for project documentation, correspondence, work change directives, change orders, photographs, and other project related documents.

3. Certification of Substantial and Final Completion

- a. Assist the County in conducting an inspection to determine if the work is substantially complete. Prepare and submit a list to the Contractor of items requiring completion or correction for the project to be considered substantially complete.
- b. Determine if the Contractor has fulfilled all of his/her contract obligations and recommend, in writing, that final payment can be made to the Contractor.

4. Limitations of Authority

- a. Chief Inspector shall not be responsible for the means, methods, techniques, sequences, or procedures of construction selected by Contractor or the safety precautions and programs incident to the work of Contractor.
- b. Chief Inspector shall not be responsible for the failure of Contractor to perform the work in accordance with the Contract Documents. The Chief Inspector shall not be responsible for the acts or omissions of any Contractor, or subcontractor, or any of the Contractors' or subcontractors' agents or employees or any other persons (except for Consultant's own employees and agents) at the site or otherwise performing any of the Contract's work.
- c. Chief Inspector shall not authorize any deviation from the Contract Documents or substitution of materials or equipment, unless authorized by the County.
- d. Chief Inspector shall not undertake any of the responsibilities of the Contractor, sub contractors, or Contractor's superintendent.

C. Required Firm/Staff Qualifications

1. Engineering firm shall provide construction engineering (inspection & material testing) services for the A-07, HP-51, & T-31 Bridge Replacement Projects in Leavenworth County. Engineer shall be on the current KDOT prequalified list related to construction inspection services.
 - a. The inspector shall have, as a minimum, the following qualifications:
 - 1) KDOT CIT certifications including, but not limited to Basic Inspection (BI), Structures (STR). All testing personnel shall possess, at a minimum, certifications for, KDOT Steel Pile Driving, and ACI Concrete Field Testing Technician. Consultant shall provide KDOT Standard Pile Driving Log inspection reports and KDOT Concrete field and lab test to include Slump, Air content, Strength Cylinders, as well as laboratory cylinder strength breaks in accordance with KDOT Testing Frequency Chart, current edition.
 - 2) Five (5) years progressively responsible experience in roadway construction inspection / observation.
 - b. By submitting a proposal, the Engineer acknowledges he or she has become familiar with contract documents. Contact Joe McAfee (jmcafee@leavenworthCounty.gov) with any questions.
2. Engineer shall provide certificates of insurance for Professional Liability (\$1,000,000.00); General Liability (\$1,000,000.00); Automobile Liability (\$1,000,000.00) and Workers Compensation (Statutory) to the County prior to commencement of services.

Action Requested: Approve the design proposal and contract with Pfefferkorn Engineering and Environmental for the replacement of culvert F-47 for \$28,000.

Analysis: F-47 is located on Leavenworth Road. It is a 6-foot round area inlet drop culvert that has experienced failures at the weld joints connecting the vertical and horizontal pipes. While this culvert is not identified for replacement in the current CIP, it is necessary to replace the culvert as soon as possible. Due to the depth, replacement of the structure is going to need to be contracted. Funds are available for this project through prioritization and it will be placed in the CIP for review this year. County staff has already completed the sizing calculations for the new culvert and acquired the necessary easement needed for replacement.

Three proposals were received for this design. This was the low-cost solution.

AGREEMENT FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES

THIS AGREEMENT made as of _____, 20____, between the County of Leavenworth, Kansas (hereinafter called the "County "), and Pfefferkorn Engineering & Environmental, LLC (hereinafter called the "Consultant").

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the Consultant represents that it is duly qualified and licensed civil engineering consultant firm, experienced in KDOT Storm Culvert and Structural Design and related civil engineering services; and

WHEREAS, in the judgement of the County of Leavenworth, it is necessary and desirable to employ the services of a consultant for said services.

WHEREAS, the Consultant represents that it has sufficient experience and qualified personnel to perform, and the County desires the Consultant to perform, the professional services herein described; and

WHEREAS, the County has determined that, of those who responded to the County's solicitation, the Consultant is the best qualified to provide the professional services described herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, the County and the Consultant, in consideration of the foregoing recitals and the mutual covenants contained herein, agree in respect to the performance of professional services by the Consultant and the payment for those services by the County as set forth below.

ARTICLE I

Scope of Project Work & Construction Engineering Services

The Consultant shall provide for the Preliminary Surveying and Design Engineering Professional services listed in attached Exhibit A: LVCO F-47 Culvert Request for Proposal.

ARTICLE II

Compensation

The County shall pay the Consultant for services performed, as outlined in Article I, on an hourly rate. Total compensation for hourly costs and reimbursable expenses shall not exceed the maximum compensation listed in the attached Consultants proposal which includes total compensation for design and land surveying hours along with all required direct reimbursable expenses. All fees shall include salary, benefits, overhead and profit due the Consultant for all work staff and all direct expenses.

Unless otherwise agreed to all other expenses not listed including local and long-distance telephone, fax, cell phones, printing, reproductions, computer use, photographs, video, software use, postage, delivery, mileage, contract accounting, and miscellaneous shall be included in the hourly labor rates and shall not be billed or reimbursed separately.

At monthly intervals, the Consultant shall submit to the County a certified invoice for allowable costs incurred in the performance of this Agreement during the month. The County shall pay the Consultant for all undisputed work performed by the Consultant within thirty days after receipt of such invoice. Should the County take exception to or dispute any portion of the certified invoice, the County shall communicate the details and nature of the dispute to the Consultant in writing within thirty days after receipt of the invoice.

ARTICLE III

Time

The terms of this agreement shall remain in force until December 31, 2026 unless a time extension is granted or unless terminated earlier in accordance with the provisions of Article VI below.

Solely at the discretion of the County, an extension in time may be granted to the Consultant for delays recognized by the County as unavoidable. Consultant may request extension of time stating fully the reasons for such request. Extensions for unavoidable delays shall be made in writing and submitted to the County for review.

ARTICLE IV

County's Responsibilities

County shall do the following in a timely manner so as not to unreasonably delay the services of the Consultant:

1. Provide all requirements for the project, including preliminary engineering objectives and constraints, capacity and performance requirements, and budgetary limitations.
2. Furnish reports, plans and surveys in its possession that pertain to the project.
3. Review any Consultant's draft submittals.
4. Attend project progress meetings.
5. Identify, in writing, a primary point of contact through whom all communications to the Consultant shall be issued.

ARTICLE V

Consultant's Responsibilities

In addition to the basic services identified in Article I "Exhibit A: Scope of Work & Services" the consultant shall do the following:

1. Comply with local, state and federal rules, regulations and laws pertaining to this Agreement that are applicable at the time the Consultant provides Construction Engineering services. Consultant shall represent it is in good standing and full compliance with the statutes of the State of Kansas for registration of professional engineers, the FWHA and all Federal agencies.

2. Provide only KDOT qualified design and land surveying staff to perform all aspects of project scope of services.
3. Indemnify and hold harmless the County, its officers, employees, and agents, from all claims, damages, losses and expenses, including reasonable attorney's fees, arising out of or resulting from the performance of the services, provided that any such claim, damage, loss, or expense is and only to the extent caused by a negligent act, error or omission of the Consultant, its subcontractors, anyone directly or indirectly employed by any of them or anyone for whose acts any of them may be liable.
4. Maintain throughout the duration of this contract insurance in the following amounts that will protect the Consultant and the County from claims set forth below which may arise of out of or result from the Consultant's execution of the Project by Consultant or by any subcontractors or by anyone directly or indirectly employed by Consultant, or by anyone for whose acts Consultant may be liable. The County shall be identified as an "additional named insured" and Consultant will, upon request of the County, furnish copy of certificate of insurance thereof:

(a) Worker's Compensation and Employer's Liability

(b) Comprehensive Automobile Liability

The Consultant shall maintain Professional Liability Insurance in an amount of \$1,000,000 and provide County with certification thereof upon request.

6. Employ persons qualified to efficiently perform the obligations and duties of the Consultant under this Agreement. If the County shall so direct, the Consultant shall remove from the project any engineer, architect, surveyor, technician, inspector, project manager, geologist, appraiser or other person employed by the Consultant in connection with the work.

7. Consultant will exercise reasonable skill, care, and diligence in the performance of Consultant's services and will carry out its responsibilities in accordance with customarily accepted professional engineering practices. If the Consultant fails to meet the foregoing standard, Consultant will perform at its own cost, and without reimbursement from County, the professional services necessary to correct errors and omissions which are caused by Consultant's failure to comply with above standard, and which are reported to Consultant within one year from the completion of Consultant's services for the Project.

ARTICLE VI

Miscellaneous

1. **Terms Herein Controlling Provisions.** It is expressly agreed that the terms of each and every provision in this attachment shall prevail and control over the terms of any other conflicting provision in any other document relating to and a part of the agreement in which this attachment is incorporated. Any terms that conflict or could be interpreted to conflict with this attachment are nullified.
2. **Governing Law and Venue.** This Agreement is subject to, governed by, and construed according to the laws of the State of Kansas. Jurisdiction and venue of any suit in connection with the Agreement shall reside only in courts located in Leavenworth County, Kansas.
3. **Compliance with Law.** Consultant shall comply with all applicable local, state, and federal laws and regulations in carrying out this Agreement, regardless of whether those legal requirements are specifically referenced in this Agreement.
4. **Modification of Agreement.** This Agreement may be modified or amended only in writing executed by both parties and will be subject to renegotiation in the event of changes to applicable law, rules, or regulations affecting the subject matter of this Agreement.
5. **Assignment.** Neither the Consultant nor the County shall, sell, transfer, assign, or otherwise dispose of any rights or obligations created by this Agreement without the written consent of the other party.
6. **Cash Basis Law.** This Agreement is subject to the Kansas Cash Basis Law, K.S.A. 10-1101 *et seq.* and amendments thereto. Any automatic renewal of the terms of the Agreement shall create no legal obligation on the part of the County. This Agreement shall be construed and interpreted so as to ensure that the County shall at all times stay in conformity with such laws and, as a condition of this Agreement, the County reserves the right to unilaterally sever, modify, or terminate this Agreement at any time if, in the opinion of its legal counsel, the Agreement is deemed to violate the terms of such law. The County is obligated only to pay periodic payments or monthly installments under the Agreement as may lawfully be made from (a) funds budgeted and appropriated for that

purpose during the County's current budget year or (b) funds made available from any lawfully operated revenue producing source.

7. **Payment of Taxes.** The County shall not be responsible for, nor indemnify the Consultant for any federal, state, or local taxes which may be imposed or levied upon the subject matter of this Agreement.
8. **Licenses and Permits.** Consultant shall maintain all licenses, permits, certifications, bonds, and insurance required by federal, state, or local authority for carrying out this Agreement. Consultant shall notify the County immediately if any required license, permit, bond, or insurance is cancelled, suspended, or is otherwise ineffective. Such cancellation, suspension, or other ineffectiveness may form the basis for immediate termination by the County in its discretion.
9. **Independent Consultant Relation.** The parties agree that the legal relationship between them is of a contractual nature. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to create a relationship of employer and employee or principal and agent or any other relationship other than that of independent parties contracting with each other solely for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of this Agreement. Nothing in this Agreement shall create any right or remedies in any third party. The parties agree that no persons supplied by the Consultant are employees of the County and that no right of the County's civil service, retirement, or personnel rules accrue to such persons. The County shall not be responsible for withholding of social security, workers compensation insurance, unemployment compensation, bonuses, retirement benefits, other benefits, and any taxes and premiums from any payments made by the County to the Consultant.
10. **Anti-Discrimination Clause:** Consultant agrees: (a) to comply with the Kansas Act Against Discrimination (K.S.A. 44-1001 et seq.) and the Kansas Age Discrimination in Employment Act (K.S.A. 44-1111 et seq.) and the applicable provisions of the Americans With Disabilities Act (42 U.S.C. 12101 et seq.) (ADA), and Kansas Executive Order No. 19-02, and to not discriminate against any person because of race, color, gender, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, religion, national origin, ancestry, age, military or veteran status, disability status, marital or family status, genetic information, or political affiliation that is unrelated to the person's ability to reasonably perform the duties of a particular job or position; (b) to include in all solicitations or advertisements for employees, the phrase "equal opportunity employer"; (c) to comply with the reporting requirements set out at K.S.A. 44-1031 and K.S.A. 44-1116; (d) to include those provisions in every subcontract or purchase order so that they are binding upon such subcontractor or vendor; (e) that a failure to comply with the reporting requirements of (c) above or if the Consultant is found guilty of any violation of such acts by the Kansas Human Rights Commission, such violation shall constitute a breach of contract and the agreement may be cancelled, terminated or suspended, in whole or in part, by the contracting state agency or the Kansas Department of Administration; (f) if it is determined that the Consultant has violated applicable provisions of ADA, such violation shall constitute a breach of contract and the agreement may be cancelled, terminated or suspended, in whole or in part, by the University or the Kansas Department of Administration.

Consultant agrees to comply with all applicable state and federal anti-discrimination laws.

The provisions of this paragraph number 10 (with the exception of those provisions relating to the ADA) are not applicable to a Consultant who employs fewer than four employees during the term of such contract or whose contracts with the contracting State agency cumulatively total \$5,000 or less during the fiscal year of such agency.

11. **Representative's Authority to Contract.** By signing this contract, the representative of Consultant thereby represents that such person is duly authorized by Consultant to execute this contract on behalf of Consultant and that Consultant agrees to be bound by the provisions thereof.
12. **Waiver of Breach.** The waiver by either party of a breach of any provision of this Agreement will not operate or be construed as a waiver of any subsequent breach by such party.
13. **Severability.** If a court of competent jurisdiction declares any part of this Agreement to be invalid, the balance of the agreement will remain valid and enforceable.
14. **Entire Agreement.** This Agreement and its attachments set forth the parties' entire agreement. Neither party has made any oral or side agreements or representations not contained in this Agreement. This is a legal document and not a mere recital and is binding upon the parties, their representatives, and successors in interest.
15. **Disclaimer of Liability.** The County shall not hold harmless or indemnify the Consultant for any liability whatsoever. No provision of this Agreement will be given effect that attempts to require the County to defend, hold harmless, or indemnify any Consultant or third party for any acts or omissions. The liability of the County is defined under the Kansas Tort Claims Act (K.S.A. 75-6101 et seq.).
16. **Termination for Default.** If the Consultant refuses or fails to perform any of the provisions of this Agreement with such diligence as will ensure its completion within the time specified in this Agreement, or any extension thereof, or commits any other substantial breach of this Agreement, the County may notify the Consultant in writing of the delay or nonperformance and, if not cured in ten days or any longer time specified in writing by the County, the County may terminate the Consultant's rights to proceed with the Agreement or such part of the Agreement as to which there has been delay or a failure to properly perform.

The County shall pay the Consultant the costs and expenses and reasonable profit for services performed by the Consultant prior to receipt of the notice of termination; however, the County may withhold from amounts due the Consultant such sums as the County deems to be necessary to protect the County against loss caused by the Consultant because of the default.

Except with respect to defaults of subcontractors, the Consultant shall not be in default by reason of any failure in performance of this Agreement in accordance with its terms if the Consultant has notified the County within 15 days of the cause of the delay and the failure arises out of causes such as acts of God, acts of the public enemy, act of the County and any other governmental entity in its sovereign or contractual capacity, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions, strikes, or other labor disputes. If the failure to perform is caused by the failure of a subcontractors to perform or to make progress, and if such failure arises out of causes similar to those set forth above, the Consultant shall not be deemed to be in default, unless the services to be furnished by the subcontractors were reasonably obtainable from other sources in sufficient time to permit the Consultant to meet the contract requirements Upon request of the Consultant, the County shall ascertain the facts and extent of such failure, and, if such officer determines that any failure to perform was occasioned by any one or more of the excusable causes, and that, but for the excusable cause, the Consultant's progress and performance would have met the terms of the Agreement, the time for completion of the Agreement shall be revised accordingly.

If, after notice of termination of the Consultant's right to proceed under the provisions of this clause, it is determined for any reason that the Consultant was not in default under the provisions of this clause, and both the County and the Consultant agree, the rights and obligations of the parties shall be the same as if the notice of termination had not been issued.

The following acts committed by the Consultant will constitute a substantial breach of the Agreement and may result in termination of the Agreement:

- If the Consultant is adjudged bankrupt or insolvent;
- If the Consultant makes a general assignment for the benefit of his creditors;
- If a trustee or receiver is appointed for the Consultant or any of his property;
- If the Consultant files a petition to take advantage of any debtor's act or to reorganize under bankruptcy or applicable laws;
- If the Consultant repeatedly fails to supply sufficient services;
- If the Consultant disregards the authority of the County;
- Acts other than those specified may constitute substantial breach of this Agreement.

17. **Termination for Convenience.** The County may, when the interests of the County so require, terminate this contract in whole or in part, for the convenience of the County. The County shall give written notice of the termination to the Consultant specifying the part of the contract terminated and when termination becomes effective.

The Consultant shall incur no further obligations in connection with the terminated work

and on the date set in the notice of termination the Consultant will stop work to the extent specified. The County shall pay the Consultant the following amounts:

All costs and expenses incurred by the Consultant for work accepted by the County prior to the Consultant's receipt of the notice of termination, plus a reasonable profit for said work.

All costs and expenses incurred by the Consultant for work not yet accepted by the County but performed by the Consultant prior to receipt of the notice of termination, plus a reasonable profit for said work.

Anticipatory profit for work and services not performed by the Consultant shall not be allowed.

18. **Arbitration, Damages and Warranties.** Notwithstanding any language to the contrary, no interpretation of this Agreement shall find that the County has agreed to binding arbitration, or the payment of damages or penalties. Further, the County does not agree to pay attorney fees, costs, or late payment charges beyond those available under the Kansas Prompt Payment Act (K.S.A. 75-6403), and no provision will be given effect that attempts to exclude, modify, disclaim or otherwise attempt to limit any damages available to the County at law, including but not limited to the implied warranties of merchantability and fitness for a particular purpose.

19. **Ownership of Materials.** All property rights, including publication rights, in all interim, draft, and final reports and other documentation, including machine-readable media, produced by the Consultant in connection with the work pursuant to this Agreement, shall be in the County.

This indemnification shall not be subject to any limitations of remedies or warranties which are contained in this or any other agreement and shall survive termination of this or any other agreement between the parties hereto or thereto.
23. **Authority to Contract.** Consultant represents that it possesses legal authority to contract, that it has undertaken any official action required by its governing documents to enter into this Agreement, that its undersigned representative is duly authorized to execute this document on its behalf, that it agrees to be bound by all the provisions of this Agreement, and that the person identified as its official representative is authorized to act on its behalf in the implementation of this Agreement.

Another invasive species to be on the lookout for is Old World Blue Stem as it starts moving into the area.

Another species although not a noxious weed is the Braford pear Tree, and Bush Honey suckle is an invasive tree species becoming a problem in the rights-of-way throughout the county which has already been banned in other states. Currently being discussed to become state noxious weeds
