

## **Man sentenced to prison on meth possession, distribution charges**

LEAVENWORTH, Kan. --- A Lansing man found to have possessed more than 100 grams of methamphetamine following a rollover crash will serve time in prison.

Ryan Duane Case, born September 10, 1981, was sentenced today to 55 months in prison on a possession charge with intent to distribute methamphetamine and 11 months in prison on possession of drug paraphernalia. Both sentences will run concurrently.

Case was taken into custody on the evening of December 7, 2022. Court documents state that Case was standing outside his car at the intersection of 147th Street and McIntyre Road when a law enforcement officer arrived.

Case's vehicle had been involved in a single-vehicle rollover crash. While on the scene, law enforcement determined that Case possessed a backpack containing more than 100 grams of methamphetamine.

Leavenworth County Attorney Todd Thompson said, "Methamphetamine is an insidious drug that we will continue to fight to get off our streets."
