LEAVENWORTH, Kan. --- A 25-year-old man from Leavenworth, who undressed after breaking a window at a local Domino's Pizza store, is now awaiting sentencing.

During a March 5, 2025 hearing, Dalton W. Saffer pleaded guilty to **Battery** and **Criminal Damage** charges. The charges stem from an incident on Oct. 6, 2024, when Saffer shattered a window of a Domino's Pizza located on South 5th Street. When police arrived, Saffer was found sitting on the ground and claiming to be God. When officers attempted to move him from the parking lot, Saffer stood up and fully undressed. While officers worked to detain Saffer, he slapped one of them.

Leavenworth County Attorney Todd Thompson said, "When crimes occur, we have to focus on the laws that were violated and the harm done to the victims." Thompson continued, "We're thankful for the quick actions displayed by these officers who were able to quickly get the situation under control."

Sentencing is scheduled for April 9, 2025.
