LEAVENWORTH, Kan. --- A 77-year-old Lansing man has pleaded no contest to charges of **possession of a controlled substance** and **driving under the influence** stemming from a September 2024 arrest.

Danny L. Granger entered the plea on Friday in Leavenworth County District Court. His sentencing is scheduled for April 18, 2025.

Granger was arrested on Sept. 5, 2024, after Leavenworth police responded to a traffic complaint near the intersection of South 20th Street and 19th Terrace. Officers found Granger in the driver's seat of a vehicle. The vehicle had suffered a flat tire, which Granger said was caused by hitting a curb. During the investigation, police discovered an illegal drug inside the car and determined Granger was under the influence.

Following the arrest, Granger was charged with **possession of a controlled substance** and **driving under the influence**.

Leavenworth County Attorney Todd Thompson stated, "Drug possession and driving under the influence do not mix. It is dangerous and illegal."
