**AGREEMENT FOR
ENGINEERING SERVICES**

THIS AGREEMENT, is between the Board of County Commissioners, Leavenworth County, Kansas (Owner) and Finney & Turnipseed, Transportation & Civil Engineering, L.L.C. (Engineer);

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Owner wishes to employ the Engineer to perform professional engineering services for the 2022 Biennial Bridge Inspection and Appraisal and Asset Management Services. These services include providing the biennial bridge inventory inspection and appraisal for 144 County bridges (the Project);

and,

WHEREAS, the Owner requires certain engineering services in connection with the Project (the Services);

and,

WHEREAS, the Engineer is prepared to provide the Services;

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the promises contained in this Agreement, the Owner and Engineer agree to the following:

ARTICLE 1 - EFFECTIVE DATE

The effective date of this Agreement shall be _____

ARTICLE 2 - GOVERNING LAW

This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Kansas and the codes of Leavenworth County, Kansas.

ARTICLE 3 - SERVICES TO BE PERFORMED BY ENGINEER

Engineer shall perform the Services described in Attachment A, Scope of Services, in accordance with applicable sections of the National Bridge Inspection Standards (latest version) and the latest KDOT bridge inspection, reporting, rating and analysis requirements as well as applicable Federal Regulations.

ARTICLE 4 - COMPENSATION

Owner shall pay Engineer in accordance with the Attachment B, Compensation.

ARTICLE 5 – OWNER’S RESPONSIBILITIES

Owner shall be responsible for all matters described in Attachment C, Owner's Responsibilities.

ARTICLE 6 - SUPPLEMENTAL AGREEMENTS

The provisions set forth in Attachment D, Supplemental Agreements shall be incorporated into this Agreement

ARTICLE 7 - PROJECT SCHEDULE

The provisions set forth in the Attachment E, Project Schedule shall be incorporated into this Agreement.

ARTICLE 8 - STANDARD OF CARE

Engineer shall exercise the same degree of care, skill, and diligence in the performance of Services as is ordinarily possessed and exercised by a professional engineer under similar circumstances.

ARTICLE 9 - INDEMNIFICATION AND INSURANCE

Engineer hereby agrees to indemnify and hold harmless Owner and any of its departments, divisions, agencies, officers, and employees and elected officials from all loss, damage, cost, or expenses specifically including attorneys' fees and other expenses of litigation incurred by or on behalf of the Owner and any or its officers, employees or elected officials arising out of Engineer's negligent performance of Services under this Agreement.

Engineer specifically agrees that this duty to indemnify and hold harmless will apply to the following:

- a. Claims, suits, or action of every kind and description when such suits or actions arise from the alleged negligent acts, errors, or omissions of the Engineer, its employees, agents, or subcontractors.
- b. Injury or damages received or sustained by any party because of the negligent acts, errors, or omissions of the Engineer, its employees, agents, or subcontractors.

Engineer shall purchase and maintain during the life of this Agreement, insurance coverage which will satisfactorily insure him against claims and liabilities which arise because of the execution of this Agreement.

The insurance coverages are as follows:

- (1) Commercial General Liability Insurance, with a limit of \$1,000,000 for each occurrence and \$2,000,000 in the general aggregate.
- (2) Automobile Liability Insurance, with a limit of \$1,000,000 for each accident, combined single limit for bodily injury and property damage.
- (3) Worker's Compensation Insurance and Employer's Liability Insurance, in accordance with statutory requirements, with a limit of \$500,000 for each accident.
- (4) Professional Liability Insurance, with a limit of \$1,000,000 for each claim and aggregate.

Prior to issuance of the Notice to Proceed by Owner, Engineer shall have on file with Owner certificates of insurance acceptable to Owner. Said certificates of insurance shall be filed with Owner in January of each year or may be submitted with each agreement.

Engineer shall also maintain valuable papers insurance to assure the restoration of any plans, drawings, field notes or other similar data relating to the work covered by this agreement, in the event of their loss or destruction, until such time as the work has been delivered to the Owner.

Upon completion of all Services, obligations, and duties provided for in this Agreement, or if this Agreement is terminated for any reason, the terms and conditions of this Article shall survive.

ARTICLE 10 - LIMITATIONS OF RESPONSIBILITY

Engineer shall not be responsible for: (1) construction means, methods, techniques, sequences, procedures, or safety precautions and programs in connection with the Project, (2) the failure of any contractor, subcontractor, vendor, or other Project participant, not under contract to Engineer, to fulfill contractual responsibilities to the Owner or to comply with federal, state or local laws, regulations, and codes; or (3) procuring permits, certificates, and licenses required for any construction unless such responsibilities are specifically assigned to Engineer in Attachment A, Scope of Services.

ARTICLE 11 - OPINIONS OF COST AND SCHEDULE

Since Engineer has no control over the cost of labor, materials, or equipment furnished by others, or over the resources provided by others to meet Project construction schedules, Engineer's opinion of probable construction costs and of construction schedules shall be made on the basis of experience and qualifications as a professional engineer. Engineer does not guarantee that proposals, bids, or actual Project construction costs will not vary from Engineer's cost estimates or that actual construction schedules will not vary from Engineer's projected schedules.

ARTICLE 12 - REUSE OF DOCUMENTS

All documents, including, but not limited to, drawings, specifications, and computer software prepared by Engineer pursuant to the Agreement are instruments of service in respect to the Project. They are not intended or represented to be suitable for reuse by Owner or others on extensions of the Project or on any other project. Any reuse without prior written verification or adaptation by Engineer for the specific purpose intended will be at Owner's sole risk and without liability or legal exposure to Engineer. Any verification or adaptation requested by Owner shall entitle Engineer to compensation at rates to be agreed upon by Owner and Engineer.

ARTICLE 13 - OWNERSHIP OF DOCUMENTS AND INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY

Except as otherwise provided herein, engineering documents, drawings, and specifications prepared by Engineer as part of the Services shall become the sole property of Owner, however, that both Owner and Engineer shall have the unrestricted right to their use. Engineer shall retain its rights in its standard drawing details, specifications, data bases, computer software, and other proprietary property protected under the copyright laws of the United States. Rights to intellectual property developed, utilized, or modified in the performance of services shall remain the property of Engineer. Owner shall have the unlimited right to the use of intellectual property developed, utilized, or modified in the performance of the Services at no additional cost to the Owner.

ARTICLE 14 - TERMINATION

This Agreement may be terminated by either party upon written notice in the event of substantial failure by the other party to perform in accordance with the terms of this Agreement. The nonperforming party shall have fifteen calendar days from the date of the termination notice to cure or to submit a plan for cure acceptable to the other party. Owner may terminate or suspend performance of this Agreement for Owner's convenience upon written

notice to Engineer. Engineer shall terminate or suspend performance of the Services on a schedule acceptable to Owner. If termination or suspension is for Owner's convenience, Owner shall pay Engineer for all Services performed prior to the date of the termination notice. Upon restart, an adjustment acceptable to Owner and Engineer shall be made to Engineer's compensation.

ARTICLE 15 - DELAY IN PERFORMANCE

Neither Owner nor Engineer shall be considered in default of the Agreement for delays in performance caused by circumstances beyond the reasonable control of the nonconforming party. For purposes of this Agreement, such circumstances include abnormal weather conditions; floods; earthquakes; fire; epidemics; war, riots, or other civil disturbances; sabotage, judicial restraint, and inability to procure permits, licenses, or authorizations from any local, state, or federal agency for any of the supplies, materials, accesses, or services required to be provided by either Owner or Engineer under this Agreement.

Should such circumstances occur, the nonconforming party shall, within a reasonable time of being prevented from performing, give written notice to the other party describing the circumstances preventing continued performance and the efforts being made to resume performance of the Agreement

In the event Engineer is delayed in the performance of Services because of delays caused by Owner, Engineer shall have no claim against Owner for damages or contract adjustment other than an extension of time.

ARTICLE 16 - COMMUNICATIONS

Any communication required by this Agreement shall be made in writing to the address specified below:

Nothing contained in the Article shall be construed to restrict the transmission of routine communications between representatives of Engineer and Owner.

ARTICLE 17 - WAIVER

A waiver by either Owner or Engineer of any breach of this Agreement shall be in writing. Such a waiver shall not affect the waiving party's rights with respect to any other or further breach.

ARTICLE 18 - SEVERABILITY

The invalidity, illegality, or unenforceability of any provision of this Agreement or the occurrence of any event rendering any portion or provision of this Agreement void shall in no way affect the validity or enforceability of any other portion or provision of this Agreement. Any void provision shall be deemed severed from this Agreement, and the balance of this Agreement shall be construed and enforced as if this Agreement did not contain the particular portion or provision held to be void. The parties further agree to amend this Agreement to replace any stricken provision with a valid provision that comes as close as possible to the intent of the stricken provision. The provisions of this Article shall not prevent this entire Agreement from being void should a provision which is of the essence of this Agreement be determined void.

ARTICLE 19 - INTEGRATION

This Agreement represents the entire and integrated agreement between Owner and Engineer. All prior and contemporaneous communications, representations, and agreements by Engineer, whether oral or written, relating to the subject matter of this Agreement, as set forth in Attachment D, Supplemental Agreements are hereby incorporated into and shall become a part of this Agreement.

ARTICLE 20 - SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS

Owner and Engineer each binds itself and its directors, officers, partners, successors, executors, administrators, assigns, and legal representatives to the other party of this Agreement and to the directors, officers, partners, successors, executors, administrators, assigns, and legal representatives of such other party in respect to all provisions of this Agreement.

ARTICLE 21 - ASSIGNMENT

Neither Owner nor Engineer shall assign any rights or duties under this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other party. Unless otherwise stated in the written consent to an assignment, no assignment will release or discharge the assignor from any obligation under this Agreement. Nothing contained in this Article shall prevent

Engineer from employing independent consultants, associates, and subcontractors to assist in the performance of the Services; however, other agreements to the contrary notwithstanding, in the event Engineer employs independent consultants, associates, and subcontractors to assist in performance of the Services, Engineer shall be solely responsible for the negligent performance of the independent consultants, associates, and subcontractors so employed.

ARTICLE 22 - THIRD PARTY RIGHTS

Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to give any rights or benefits to anyone other than Owner and Engineer.

ARTICLE 23 – RELATIONSHIP OF PARTIES

Nothing contained herein shall be construed to hold or to make the Owner a partner, joint venturer, or associate of Engineer, nor shall either party be deemed the agent of the other, it being expressly understood and agreed that the relationship between the parties hereto is and shall at all times remain contractual as provided by the terms and conditions of this Agreement.



SCOPE OF SERVICES

The project is specifically defined below:

2022 Biennial Bridge Inventory and Appraisal and asset management of 144 County bridges

The Engineer agrees to provide the following engineering services.

1. The Routine Bridge Inspections shall be conducted in accordance with federal and KDOT regulations.
2. The standard KDOT Bureau of Local Projects Bridge Inspection Form (BIF) shall be used to record the field inspection data. Critical Findings shall be recorded on the standard KDOT Bureau of Local Projects Bridge Inspection Critical Findings form.
3. All NBI Data Items shall be verified during the inspection and updated or corrected. This may require coordination with Leavenworth County on AADT and similar items not observable.
4. The work performed under this contract is subject to review by Leavenworth County as well as KDOT. If errors or discrepancies are found, the Consultant shall be required to make corrections at no additional cost. KDOT will perform QC/QA evaluations of bridge inspections including field reviews, review of ratings, bridge inspection files, and data entry. Substandard work is grounds for removal of the inspector from the KDOT prequalified list.
5. Leavenworth County has 144 bridges to be inspected for biennial inspection. Bridge inspections shall be completed no later than April 15, 2022.
6. Leavenworth County has 1 bridge that requires an individual fracture critical inspection and preparation of report for ST-44.
7. Bridges not currently in the inventory, bridges that have been replaced, or bridges that have had major rehabilitation work require an Inventory Inspection using the Inventory Inspection form in the KDOT BLP Bridge Inspection manual as well as load rating calculations and scour analysis reports. Review scour assessment information in the bridge folder, and report if the information is inadequate or needs updating.
8. Review load rating information in the bridge folder, and adjust, as warranted, to reflect conditions evident at the time of inspection.
9. A minimum of six (6) photographs are required for each structure including: roadway views along the bridge looking both directions, both elevation views of the structure, and channel from structure. All photographs are to be provided to Leavenworth County in digital format.
10. Review photographs in the bridge file; add any required photos that are not in the bridge folder. Provide new photographs of items as necessary to adequately document significant deficiencies, changed conditions, or repairs needed.

11. The Inspection Data will be entered in the KDOT BLP Bridge Inspection Web Portal within the 30-day window following the bridge inspection. All NBI Data Items in the existing database are to be checked while performing data entry, and errors in the data shall be corrected.
12. During the inspection Critical Findings shall be reported to the bridge owner immediately by the most expedient method.
13. Provide a bridge maintenance report sorted by Leavenworth County's local bridge number.
 - (1) Deliverables: Provide 5 copies of the report summarizing bridge inspection results and the maintenance recommendation report as well as a digital copy of the report submitted in PDF format. If applicable the Critical Findings forms must be submitted to KDOT BLP within one week of the inspection. Provide digital copies of all photos, SI&A sheets, inventory inspection forms, narrative reports, updated load calculations, and scour reports to update County's digital bridge copies.
14. All work shall be performed, and data entered into the KDOT portal within 90 days of the required inspection date. Required reports and assembly of updates to the bridge folder shall be completed by July 15, 2022.
15. The following services should also be included:
 - a) Summary of required location updates to LVCO GIS Map
 - b) Comprehensive (Typically 50-page) Inventory Summary Report
 - c) Executive Summary & Return on Investment Sheets for Commissioners
 - d) Updated Synopsis of 2004-2020 Bridge Inventory Accomplishments
 - e) Updates to Special Inspection & Emergency Flood Inspection Bridge Inspection Lists
 - f) Removals, Additions, Rehabilitation, Repair Inventory Update Lists
 - g) Inventory & Asset Management Data Including:
 - Distributions of Bridges (Types, Townships, Age, Condition)
 - Condition Breakdowns of Structures (By County & Townships)
 - Condition Inventory Trends by Categories
 - Load Posting Updates (Signs & Bridges)

Payments shall be made monthly in amounts which are consistent with the amount of engineering services provided, as determined by the Engineer

- B. Compensation for Supplemental Services shall be made as defined below, when authorized in writing by the Owner. The maximum limit for each item of additional service shall be established individually and specifically agreed to by the Owner as stated below, unless the service is included in a subsequent agreement.

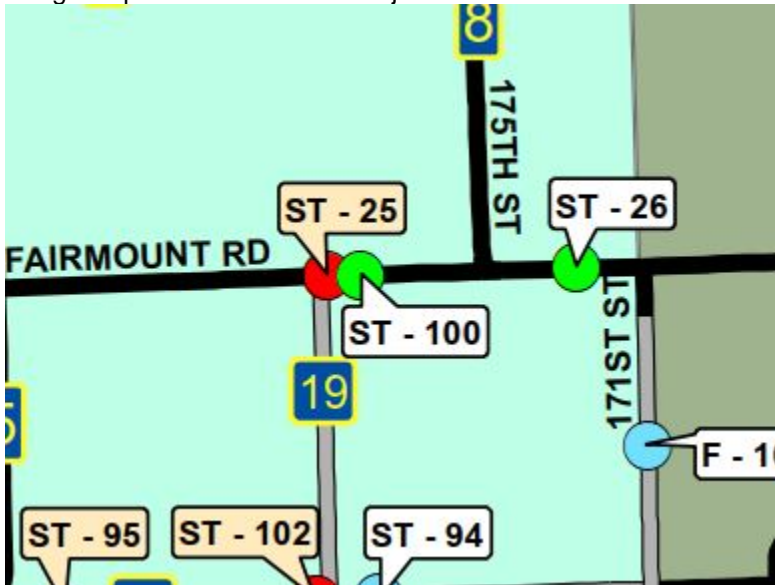

Recommendation: Approval

Analysis:

Leavenworth County was awarded funding for the ST-100 Bridge Replacement under the Off System Bridge Program.

This is a federally funded program, administered by KDOT, with an 80/20 State/Local match for the cost of construction and construction engineering expenses. Design, ROW acquisition and utility relocation are excluded expenses in the program and will require 100% local funding. Preliminary project estimates for the entire project is approximately \$705,000, with a required local funding of approximately \$275,000.

Leavenworth County is responsible for acquiring the bridge replacement design, acquisition of right-of-way and utility relocation. KDOT will let the construction contract for the project and award to the lowest responsible bidder. Additionally, KDOT will administer the construction of the project.

AGREEMENT

This Agreement is between the **Secretary of Transportation**, Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) (the “Secretary”) and **Leavenworth County, Kansas** (“County”), **collectively**, the “Parties.”

RECITALS:

- A. The Secretary has authorized an off-system bridge replacement or rehabilitation project as a part of the Federal-aid Off System Bridge Program, as further described in this Agreement.
- B. The Secretary and the County are empowered by the laws of Kansas to enter into agreements for the construction and maintenance of city and county bridges in the State of Kansas through the use of federal, state, and/or local funds, or a combination thereof.
- C. Under the terms of the Federal-Aid Highway Act and the rules and regulations of the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), states and local governments are, under certain circumstances, entitled to receive assistance through Section 104 funds in the financing of the replacement or rehabilitation of Off-System Bridges, provided such work is required to be done in accordance with the laws of the State of Kansas and any applicable federal requirements.

NOW THEREFORE, the Parties agree to the following terms and provisions.

ARTICLE I

DEFINITIONS: The following terms as used in this Agreement have the designated meanings:

1. **“Agreement”** means this written document, including all attachments and exhibits, evidencing the legally binding terms and conditions of the agreement between the Parties.
2. **“Construction”** means the work done on the Project after Letting, consisting of building, altering, repairing, improving, or demolishing any structure, building or highway; any drainage, dredging, excavation, grading or similar work upon real property.
3. **“Construction Contingency Items”** mean unforeseeable elements of cost within the defined project scope identified after the Construction phase commences.
4. **“Construction Engineering”** means inspection services, material testing, engineering consultation and other reengineering activities required during Construction of the Project.

5. **“Consultant”** means any engineering firm or other entity retained to perform services for the Project.
6. **“Contractor”** means the entity awarded the Construction contract for the Project and any subcontractors working for the Contractor with respect to the Project.
7. **“County”** means Leavenworth County, Kansas, with its place of business at 300 Walnut Street, Leavenworth, KS 66048.
8. **“Design Plans”** means design plans, specifications, estimates, surveys, and any necessary studies or investigations, including, but not limited to, environmental, hydraulic, and geological investigations or studies necessary for the Project under this Agreement.
9. **“Effective Date”** means the date this Agreement is signed by the Secretary or the Secretary’s designee.
10. **“Encroachment”** means any building, structure, vehicle, parking area, or other object or thing, including but not limited to signs, posters, billboards, roadside stands, fences, or other private installations, not authorized to be located within the Right of Way which may or may not require removal during Construction pursuant to the Design Plans.
11. **“FHWA”** means the Federal Highway Administration, a federal agency of the United States.
12. **“KDOT”** means the Kansas Department of Transportation, an agency of the State of Kansas, with its principal place of business located at 700 SW Harrison Street, Topeka, KS, 66603-3745.
13. **“Letting” or “Let”** means the process of receiving bids prior to any award of a Construction contract for any portion of the Project.
14. **“NBI”** means the National Bridge Inventory, under the jurisdiction of the U.S. Department of Transportation, Federal Highway Administration.
15. **“Non-Participating Costs”** means the costs of any items or services which the Secretary reasonably determines are not Participating Costs.
16. **“Off System Bridge”** means a highway bridge located on a public road, other than a bridge on a Federal-aid highway, or as otherwise defined by 23 U.S.C.A. § 133.
17. **“Participating Costs”** means expenditures for items or services which are an integral part of highway, bridge, and road construction projects, as reasonably determined by the Secretary.
18. **“Parties”** means the Secretary of Transportation and KDOT, individually and collectively, and the County.

19. **“Preliminary Engineering”** means pre-construction activities, including but not limited to design work, generally performed by a consulting engineering firm that takes place before Letting.
20. **“Project”** means all phases and aspects of the endeavor to be undertaken by the Secretary, being: **Replacement of Bridge No. 000000000520070 located on Fairmount Road, 2.9 miles west of Fairmount, Kansas, over Little Stranger Creek in Leavenworth County, Kansas**, and is the subject of this Agreement.
21. **“Responsible Bidder”** means one who makes an offer to construct the Project in response to a request for bid with the technical capability, financial capacity, human resources, equipment, and performance record required to perform the contractual services.
22. **“Right of Way”** means the real property and interests therein necessary for Construction of the Project, including fee simple title, dedications, permanent and temporary easements, and access rights, as shown on the Design Plans.
23. **“Secretary”** means the Secretary of Transportation of the State of Kansas, and his or her successors and assigns.
24. **“Utilities” or “Utility”** means all privately, publicly or cooperatively-owned lines, facilities and systems for producing, transmitting or distributing communications, power, electricity, light, heat, gas, oil, crude products, water, steam, waste, storm water, and other similar commodities, including fire and police signal systems which directly or indirectly serve the public.

ARTICLE II

FUNDING

1. **Funding.** The table below reflects the funding commitments of each Party. The Participating Costs of Construction include all Construction Contingency Items. The Parties agree costs and contributions are estimates to be used for encumbrance purposes and may be subject to change. The County must notify the Secretary if costs increase by 10% or more above the estimate.

Party	Responsibility
Secretary	80% of Participating Costs of Construction Engineering (CE) and Construction.
County	20% of Participating Costs of CE and Construction until Secretary’s funding limit is reached. 100% of Participating Costs of CE and Construction after Secretary’s funding limit is reached. 100% of Costs of Preliminary Engineering (PE), Right of Way (ROW), Utility Adjustments, and Non-Participating Costs.

ARTICLE III

SECRETARY RESPONSIBILITIES:

1. **Letting and Administration by KDOT.** The Secretary shall Let the contract for the Project and shall award the contract to the lowest Responsible Bidder upon concurrence in the award by the County. The Secretary further agrees, as agent for the County, to administer the Construction of the Project in accordance with the final Design Plans, as required by FHWA, to negotiate with and report to the FHWA and administer the payments due the Contractor, including any portion of the cost borne by the County.
2. **Indemnification by Contractors.** The Secretary will require the Contractor to indemnify, hold harmless, and save the Secretary and the County from personal injury and property damage claims arising out of the act or omission of the Contractor, the contractor's agent, subcontractors, or suppliers. If the Secretary or the County defends a third party's claim, the Contractor shall indemnify the Secretary and the County for damages paid to the third party and all related expenses either the Secretary or the County or both incur in defending the claim.

ARTICLE IV

COUNTY RESPONSIBILITIES:

1. **Legal Authority.** By his or her signature on this Agreement, the signatory certifies that he or she has legal and actual authority as representative and agent for the County to enter into this Agreement on its behalf. The County agrees to take any administrative and/or legal steps as may be required to give full effect to the terms of this Agreement.
2. **General Indemnification.** To the extent permitted by law and subject to the Kansas Tort Claims Act (K.S.A. § 75-6101, *et seq.*) as applicable, including but not limited to the exceptions and maximum liability provisions, the County shall defend, indemnify, hold harmless, and save the Secretary and its authorized representatives from any and all costs, liabilities, expenses, suits, judgments, damages to persons or property or claims of any nature whatsoever arising out of or in connection with the provisions or performance of this Agreement by the Secretary, the Secretary's employees, or subcontractors. The County shall not be required to defend, indemnify, hold harmless, and save the Secretary for negligent acts or omissions of the Secretary or its authorized representatives or employees.
3. **Design and Specifications.** The County shall be responsible to design the Project, or contract to have the Project designed, in conformity with the state and federal design criteria appropriate for the Project in accordance with the current Local Projects LPA Project Development Manual, Bureau of Local Project's (BLP's) project memorandums, memos, the KDOT Design Manual, Geotechnical Bridge Foundation Investigation Guidelines, Bureau of Road Design's road memorandums, and the current version of the KDOT Standard Specifications for State Road and Bridge Construction with Special Provisions, and any necessary Project Special Provisions required by the Secretary or by the

County with the Secretary's concurrence, and with the rules and regulations of the FHWA pertaining to the Project.

4. **Submission of Design Plans to Secretary.** Upon their completion, the County shall have the Design Plans submitted to the Secretary by a licensed professional engineer attesting to the conformity of the Design Plans with the items in Article IV, paragraph 3 above. The Design Plans must be signed and sealed by the licensed professional engineer responsible for preparation of the Design Plans. In addition, geological investigations or studies must be signed and sealed by either a licensed geologist or licensed professional engineer, who is responsible for the preparation of the geological investigations or studies. All technical professionals involved in the Project are required to meet the applicable licensing and/or certification requirements as stated in K.S.A. § 74-7001, *et seq.*

5. **Consultant Contract Language.** The County shall include language requiring conformity with Article IV, 3 above, in all contracts between the County and any Consultant with whom the County has contracted to perform services for the Project. In addition, any contract between the County and any Consultant retained by them to perform any of the services described or referenced in this paragraph for the Project covered by this Agreement must contain language requiring conformity with Article IV, 3 above. In addition, any contract between the County and any Consultant with whom the County has contracted to prepare and certify Design Plans for the Project covered by this Agreement must also contain the following provisions:

(a) **Completion of Design.** Language requiring completion of all plan development stages no later than the current Project schedule's due dates as issued by KDOT, exclusive of delays beyond the Consultant's control.

(b) **Progress Reports.** Language requiring the Consultant to submit to the County (and to the Secretary upon request) progress reports at monthly or at mutually agreed intervals in conformity with the official Project schedule.

(c) **Third-Party Beneficiary.** Language making the Secretary a third-party beneficiary in the agreement between the County and the Consultant. Such language shall read:

“Because of the Secretary of Transportation of the State of Kansas’ (Secretary’s) obligation to administer state funds, federal funds, or both, the Secretary shall be a third-party beneficiary to this agreement between the County and the Consultant. This third-party beneficiary status is for the limited purpose of seeking payment or reimbursement for damages and costs the Secretary or the County or both incurred or will incur because the Consultant failed to comply with its contract obligations under this Agreement or because of the Consultant’s negligent acts, errors, or omissions. Nothing in this provision precludes the County from seeking recovery or settling any dispute with the Consultant as long as such settlement does not restrict the Secretary’s right to payment or reimbursement.”

6. **Responsibility for Adequacy of Design.** The County shall be responsible for and require any Consultant retained by it to be responsible for the adequacy and accuracy of the Design Plans for the Project. Any review of these items performed by the Secretary or the Secretary's representatives is not intended to and shall not be construed to be an undertaking of the County's and its Consultant's duty to provide adequate and accurate Design Plans for the Project. Reviews by the Secretary are not done for the benefit of the Consultant, the construction Contractor, the County, any other political subdivision, or the traveling public. The Secretary makes no representation, express or implied warranty to any person or entity concerning the adequacy or accuracy of the Design Plans for the Project, or any other work performed by the Consultant or the County.

7. **Removal of Encroachments.** The County shall initiate and proceed with diligence to remove or require the removal of all Encroachments either on or above the limits of the Right of Way within its jurisdiction as shown on the final Design Plans for this Project. It is further agreed all such Encroachments will be removed before the Project is advertised for Letting; except the Secretary may permit the Project to be advertised for Letting before such Encroachment is fully removed if the Secretary determines the County and the owner thereof have fully provided for the physical removal of the Encroachment and such removal will be accomplished within a time sufficiently short to present no hindrance or delay to the Construction of the Project.

8. **Future Encroachments.** Except as provided by state and federal laws, the County agrees it will not in the future permit Encroachments upon the Right of Way of the Project.

9. **Use of Right of Way.** The Secretary shall have the right to utilize County right of way and any land owned or controlled by the County as shown on the final Design Plans, for the purpose of constructing and maintaining the Project. All right of way provided for the Project shall be used solely for public highway purposes.

10. **Accounting.** Upon request by the Secretary and in order to enable the Secretary to report all costs of the Project to the legislature, the County shall provide the Secretary an accounting of all actual Non-Participating Costs which are paid directly by the County to any party outside of the Secretary and all costs incurred by the County not to be reimbursed by the Secretary for preliminary engineering, right of way, utility adjustments, construction, and construction engineering work phases, or any other major expense associated with the Project.

11. **Utilities.**

(a) **Utility Relocation.** The County will move or adjust, or cause to be moved or adjusted, and will be responsible for such removal or adjustment of all existing Utilities necessary to construct the Project in accordance with the final Design Plans. New or existing utilities that have to be installed, moved, or adjusted will be located or relocated in accordance with the current version of the KDOT Utility Accommodation Policy (UAP), as amended or supplemented.

(b) **Cost of Relocation.** Except as provided by state and federal laws, the expense of the removal or adjustment of the Utilities located on public Right of Way shall be borne by the owners. The expense of the removal or adjustment of privately owned Utilities located on private

Right of Way or easement shall be borne by the County except as provided by state and federal laws.

12. **Maintenance.** When the Project is completed and final acceptance is issued the County will, at its own cost and expense, maintain the Project and will make ample provision each year for such maintenance. If notified by the State Transportation Engineer of any unsatisfactory maintenance condition, the County will begin the necessary repairs within thirty (30) days and will prosecute the work continuously until it is satisfactorily completed.

13. **Cancellation by County.** If the County cancels the Project, it will reimburse the Secretary for any costs incurred by the Secretary prior to the cancellation of the Project. The County agrees to reimburse the Secretary within thirty (30) days after receipt by the County of the Secretary's statement of the cost incurred by the Secretary prior to the cancellation of the Project.

ARTICLE V

FEDERAL REQUIREMENTS:

1. **System for Award Management.** The Recipient has registered with the System for Award Management (<http://www.sam.gov>), which provides a Unique Entity Identifier (SAM). The Recipient shall maintain such registration at all times during which it has active federal awards.

2. **Debarment & Suspension.** This Agreement is a covered transaction for purposes of 2 C.F.R. Parts 180 and/or 1200. By signature on this Agreement, the County verifies that neither it, nor its agents or employees, are presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, disqualified, or voluntarily excluded from participation in this transaction by any federal department or agency as reflected in the System for Award Management (SAM). Exec. Orders No. 12549 and 12689; 2 C.F.R. § 200.213.

3. **Buy America Compliance.** The Parties agree to comply with the Buy America requirements of 23 CFR § 635.410, as applicable, when purchasing items using Federal funds under this Agreement. Buy America requires the Parties to purchase only steel and iron produced in the United States, unless a waiver has been granted by FHWA or the product is subject to a general waiver. Costs for applicable materials which are not certified either compliant or under waiver will not be reimbursed. Buy America requirements apply to all contractors/subcontractors and should be incorporated through appropriate contract provisions as needed.

4. **Prohibition on Certain Technologies.** All Parties agree that they will comply with 2 CFR § 200.216 and 2 CFR § 200.471 regulations. Such regulations provide that recipients and sub-recipients of federal funds are prohibited from obligating or expending loan or grant funds to 1) procure or obtain; 2) extend or renew a contract to procure or obtain, or; 3) or enter into a contract to procure or obtain telecommunication or video surveillance equipment, services, or systems produced by: Huawei Technologies Company or ZTE Corporation (or any subsidiary or affiliate of such entities); and Hytera Communications Corporation, Hangzhou Hikvision Digital Technology Company, or Dahua Technology Company (or any subsidiary or affiliate of such entities). Any expenditures for such

telecommunication or video surveillance equipment, services or systems are unallowable costs and will not be reimbursed.

5. **Anti-Lobbying.** If the total value of this agreement exceeds \$100,000.00, a Certification for Federal Aid Contracts and Accompanying Disclosure of Lobbying Activities will be included as Attachment 6 to this Agreement and be attached and made a part of this Agreement. Such certification must state the recipient of the federal grant will not and has not used Federal appropriated funds to pay any person or organization for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a member of Congress, officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a member of Congress in connection with obtaining any Federal contract, grant or any other award covered by 31 U.S.C. § 1352. Each tier must also disclose any lobbying with non-Federal funds that takes place in connection with obtaining any Federal award. 2 C.F.R. § Pt. 200, App. II.

6. **Audit.**

(a) **Federal Audit Requirements.** All local governmental units, state agencies or instrumentalities, non-profit Organizations, institutions of higher education and Indian Tribal governments shall comply with Federal-Aid Transportation Act and the requirements of 2 C.F.R. Part 200, “Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards” (commonly known as the “Supercircular”). The Audit Standards set forth in 2 C.F.R. Part 200, “Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards,” and specifically the requirements in Subpart F, 2 C.F.R. § 200.500, *et seq.* require either a single or program specific audit be performed by an independent certified public accountant in accordance with these standards. All information audited and audit standards and procedures shall comply with 2 C.F.R. § 200.500, *et seq.*

(b) **Agency Audit.** The Secretary and/or the FHWA may request, in their sole discretion, to conduct an audit of the Project. Upon the request of the Secretary and/or the FHWA for an audit, the County will participate and cooperate in the audit and shall make its records and books available to representatives of the requesting agency for a period of five (5) years after date of final payment under this Agreement. If the audit reveals payments have been made with federal funds by the County for items considered Non-Participating Costs, the County shall promptly reimburse the Secretary for such items upon notification by the Secretary.

ARTICLE VI

GENERAL PROVISIONS:

1. **Incorporation of Design Plans.** The final Design Plans for the Project are by this reference made a part of this Agreement.

2. **Traffic Control.** The Parties agree to the following with regard to traffic control for the Project:

(a) **Temporary Traffic Control.** The Secretary shall determine in consultation with the County the manner in which traffic is to be handled during Construction. Before the final Design

Plans have been completed, detour routes and street closings, if necessary, shall be agreed upon by authorized representatives of the County and the Secretary, and noted on the final Design Plans. If revisions to the traffic handling plan are proposed during the progress of Construction, the County and the Secretary shall approve such revisions before they become effective.

(b) **Permanent Traffic Control.** The location, form, and character of informational, regulatory and warning signs, of traffic signals and of curb and pavement or other markings installed or placed by any public authority, or other agency as authorized by K.S.A. § 8-2005, must conform to the latest version of the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD) as adopted by the Secretary.

3. **Local Ordinances.** The Secretary is not required to follow any local zoning ordinances in the Construction of the Project.

4. **Civil Rights Act.** The “Special Attachment No. 1, Rev. 09.20.17” pertaining to the implementation of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, is attached and made a part of this Agreement.

5. **Contractual Provisions.** The provisions found in the current version of “Contractual Provisions Attachment (Form DA-146a),” which is attached, are hereby incorporated into and made a part of this Agreement.

6. **Termination.** If, in the judgment of the Secretary, sufficient funds are not appropriated to continue the function performed in this Agreement and for the payment of the charges hereunder, the Secretary may terminate this Agreement. The Secretary will participate in all costs approved by the Secretary incurred prior to the termination of the Agreement.

7. **Headings.** All headings in this Agreement have been included for convenience of reference only and are not to be deemed to control or affect the meaning or construction or the provisions herein.

8. **Binding Agreement.** This Agreement and all contracts entered into under the provisions of this Agreement shall be binding upon the Secretary and the County and their successors in office.

9. **No Third-Party Beneficiaries.** No third-party beneficiaries are intended to be created by this Agreement and nothing in this Agreement authorizes third parties to maintain a suit for damages pursuant to the terms or provisions of this Agreement.

10. **Counterparts.** This Agreement may be executed in several counterparts, each of which shall be an original and all of which shall constitute but one and the same agreement.

11. **Severability.** If any provision of this Agreement is held invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions which can be given effect without the invalid provision, and to this end the provisions of this Agreement are severable.

1. **Terms Herein Controlling Provisions:** It is expressly agreed that the terms of each and every provision in this attachment shall prevail and control over the terms of any other conflicting provision in any other document relating to and a part of the contract in which this attachment is incorporated. Any terms that conflict or could be interpreted to conflict with this attachment are nullified.
2. **Kansas Law and Venue:** This contract shall be subject to, governed by, and construed according to the laws of the State of Kansas, and jurisdiction and venue of any suit in connection with this contract shall reside only in courts located in the State of Kansas.
3. **Termination Due To Lack Of Funding Appropriation:** If, in the judgment of the Director of Accounts and Reports, Department of Administration, sufficient funds are not appropriated to continue the function performed in this agreement and for the payment of the charges hereunder, State may terminate this agreement at the end of its current fiscal year. State agrees to give written notice of termination to contractor at least thirty (30) days prior to the end of its current fiscal year and shall give such notice for a greater period prior to the end of such fiscal year as may be provided in this contract, except that such notice shall not be required prior to ninety (90) days before the end of such fiscal year. Contractor shall have the right, at the end of such fiscal year, to take possession of any equipment provided State under the contract. State will pay to the contractor all regular contractual payments incurred through the end of such fiscal year, plus contractual charges incidental to the return of any such equipment. Upon termination of the agreement by State, title to any such equipment shall revert to contractor at the end of the State's current fiscal year. The termination of the contract pursuant to this paragraph shall not cause any penalty to be charged to the agency or the contractor.
4. **Disclaimer Of Liability:** No provision of this contract will be given effect that attempts to require the State of Kansas or its agencies to defend, hold harmless, or indemnify any contractor or third party for any acts or omissions. The liability of the State of Kansas is defined under the Kansas Tort Claims Act (K.S.A. 75-6101, *et seq.*).
5. **Anti-Discrimination Clause:** The contractor agrees: (a) to comply with the Kansas Act Against Discrimination (K.S.A. 44-1001, *et seq.*) and the Kansas Age Discrimination in Employment Act (K.S.A. 44-1111, *et seq.*) and the applicable provisions of the Americans With Disabilities Act (42 U.S.C. 12101, *et seq.*) (ADA), and Kansas Executive Order No. 19-02, and to not discriminate against any person because of race, color, gender, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, religion, national origin, ancestry, age, military or veteran status, disability status, marital or family status, genetic information, or political affiliation that is unrelated to the person's ability to reasonably perform the duties of a particular job or position; (b) to include in all solicitations or advertisements for employees, the phrase "equal opportunity employer"; (c) to

comply with the reporting requirements set out at K.S.A. 44-1031 and K.S.A. 44-1116; (d) to include those provisions in every subcontract or purchase order so that they are binding upon such subcontractor or vendor; (e) that a failure to comply with the reporting requirements of (c) above or if the contractor is found guilty of any violation of such acts by the Kansas Human Rights Commission, such violation shall constitute a breach of contract and the contract may be cancelled, terminated or suspended, in whole or in part, by the contracting state agency or the Kansas Department of Administration; (f) Contractor agrees to comply with all applicable state and federal anti-discrimination laws and regulations; (g) Contractor agrees all hiring must be on the basis of individual merit and qualifications, and discrimination or harassment of persons for the reasons stated above is prohibited; and (h) if it is determined that the contractor has violated the provisions of any portion of this paragraph, such violation shall constitute a breach of contract and the contract may be canceled, terminated, or suspended, in whole or in part, by the contracting state agency or the Kansas Department of Administration.

6. **Acceptance of Contract:** This contract shall not be considered accepted, approved or otherwise effective until the statutorily required approvals and certifications have been given.
7. **Arbitration, Damages, Warranties:** Notwithstanding any language to the contrary, no interpretation of this contract shall find that the State or its agencies have agreed to binding arbitration, or the payment of damages or penalties. Further, the State of Kansas and its agencies do not agree to pay attorney fees, costs, or late payment charges beyond those available under the Kansas Prompt Payment Act (K.S.A. 75-6403), and no provision will be given effect that attempts to exclude, modify, disclaim or otherwise attempt to limit any damages available to the State of Kansas or its agencies at law, including but not limited to, the implied warranties of merchantability and fitness for a particular purpose.
8. **Representative's Authority to Contract:** By signing this contract, the representative of the contractor thereby represents that such person is duly authorized by the contractor to execute this contract on behalf of the contractor and that the contractor agrees to be bound by the provisions thereof.
9. **Responsibility for Taxes:** The State of Kansas and its agencies shall not be responsible for, nor indemnify a contractor for, any federal, state or local taxes which may be imposed or levied upon the subject matter of this contract.
10. **Insurance:** The State of Kansas and its agencies shall not be required to purchase any insurance against loss or damage to property or any other subject matter relating to this contract, nor shall this contract require them to establish a "self-insurance" fund to protect against any such loss or damage. Subject to the provisions of the Kansas Tort Claims Act (K.S.A. 75-6101, *et seq.*), the contractor shall bear the risk of any loss or damage to any property in which the contractor holds title.
11. **Information:** No provision of this contract shall be construed as limiting the Legislative Division of Post Audit from having access to information pursuant to K.S.A. 46-1101, *et seq.*
12. **The Eleventh Amendment:** "The Eleventh Amendment is an inherent and incumbent protection with the State of Kansas and need not be reserved, but prudence requires the State to reiterate that nothing related to this contract shall be deemed a waiver of the Eleventh Amendment."
13. **Campaign Contributions / Lobbying:** Funds provided through a grant award or contract shall not be given or received in exchange for the making of a campaign contribution. No part of the funds provided through this contract shall be used to influence or attempt to influence an officer or employee of any State of Kansas agency or a member of the Legislature regarding any pending legislation or the awarding, extension, continuation, renewal, amendment or modification of any government contract, grant, loan, or cooperative agreement.

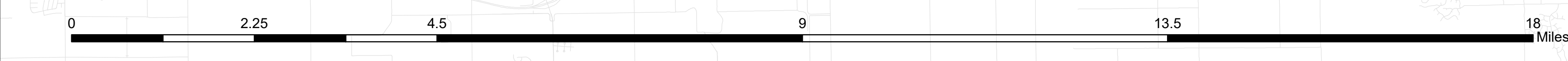
