A PROCLAMATION OF MARCH 2025 AS A MONTH CELEBRATING SENIOR NUTRITION PROGRAMS AND THEIR EFFORTS TO END THE WAIT

WHEREAS, on March 22, 1972, President Nixon signed into law a measure that amended the Older Americans Act of 1965 to include a national nutrition program for individuals 60 years and older; and,

WHEREAS, for over five decades, this landmark law has supported our nation’s seniors and helped to fund community-based organizations – like Meals on Wheels – and it is still the only federal program designed specifically to meet the nutritional and social needs of older adults; and,

WHEREAS, the Meals on Wheels program in Leavenworth County provides nutritious meals, both congregate and home-delivered, to seniors that help them maintain their health and independence and provide necessary connections; and,

WHEREAS, Council on Aging staff and volunteers are the backbone of the Meals on Wheels program in Leavenworth County, delivering nutritious meals to seniors and individuals with disabilities who are at significant risk of hunger and isolation with caring concern and attention to their welfare; and,

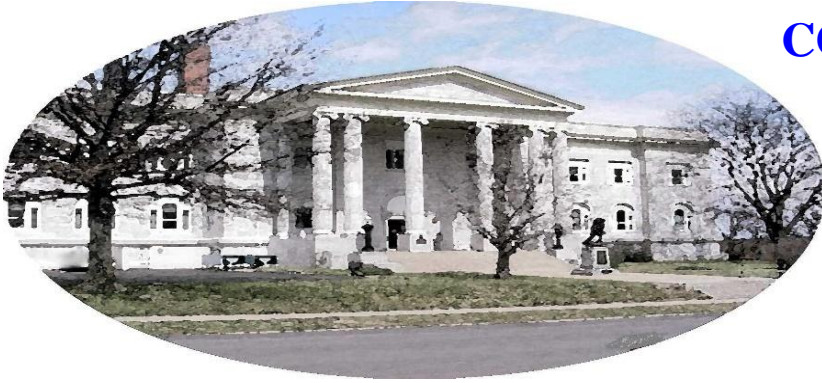
WHEREAS, the Meals on Wheels program in Leavenworth County offers a powerful opportunity for social connection for hundreds of seniors to help combat the negative health effects and economic consequences of loneliness and isolation; and,

WHEREAS, nearly 13 million seniors are still threatened by or experience hunger, 56% of seniors are lonely, and 1 in 3 Meals on Wheels programs, including Leavenworth County’s program, has a waitlist; and,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Michael Smith, as Chairperson of the Leavenworth County Board of Commissioners, do hereby proclaim March 2025 as a month celebrating senior nutrition programs and urge every community member to take this month to honor our senior nutrition programs, the individuals they serve and the volunteers and staff who care for them. We hereby recognize, the Older Americans Act Nutrition Program and Meals on Wheels programs for their heroic efforts to End the Wait and help combat senior hunger and isolation in America.

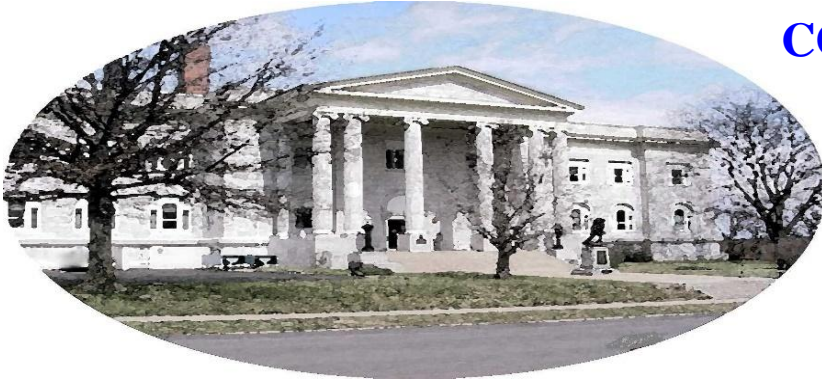

This one-year agreement would allow the *Council on Aging* to provide transportation services for the participants of The Deeper Window Association's programs, *Let's Roll* and *Our Place – Leavenworth* to and from The Deeper Window Association, 729 Pennsylvania, Leavenworth, KS 66048, and door-to-door transportation service for qualifying participants to pre-determined and approved locations within a 35-mile radius of the agency. The participants of The Deeper Window Association will be accompanied by a trained employees and/or volunteers of the agency at all times.

Memorandum of Understanding

This Memorandum of Understanding is made and entered as of the 5th day of March 2025 by and between The Deeper Window Association (“TDWA”), and County of Leavenworth, Kansas (“Leavenworth County”). The Deeper Window Association offers services and social engagement programs to those living with dementia and support for their care partners through support groups, education and resources.

Whereas, TDWA and Leavenworth County desire to enter into an agreement for Leavenworth County to provide transportation for *Let’s Roll* and *Our Place Leavenworth* programs for TDWA’s participants; and

Now, therefore the parties agree as follows:

1. **Services.** Leavenworth County shall provide transportation for the participants of The Deeper Window Association’s programs, *Let’s Roll* and *Our Place – Leavenworth* to and from The Deeper Window Association, 729 Pennsylvania, Leavenworth, KS 66048, and door-to-door transportation service for qualifying participants to the pre-determined and approved location within a 35-mile radius of the agency. Notification of changes to trip locations or departure times must be received in writing and approved by the Leavenworth County Council on Aging Director no less than 24 hours prior to the proposed trip departure date/time. The participants of The Deeper Window Association will be accompanied by a trained TDWA employee or volunteer of the agency at all times, excluding the Leavenworth County driver.
2. **Term.** Either agency at any time during the life of this agreement may terminate the agreement by giving 30 days written notice of its intention to the other party. This agreement will automatically renew on January 1st of each year unless either party provides 30 days prior notice.
3. **Payment.** TDWA shall pay Leavenworth County a fee in the amount of \$7.00 per participant per trip for each *Let’s Roll* and *Our Place Leavenworth* program for which the Leavenworth County provides transportation.
4. **Time of Payment.** Leavenworth County shall collect payment for transportation services from TDWA at the time of service.
5. **Cash Basis Law.** This Agreement is subject to the Kansas Cash Basis Law, K.S.A. 10-1101 et seq. and amendments thereto. Any automatic renewal of the terms of the Agreement shall create no legal obligation on the part of Leavenworth County. This Agreement shall be construed and interpreted so as to ensure that Leavenworth County shall at all times stay in conformity with such laws and, as a condition of this Agreement, Leavenworth County reserves the right to unilaterally sever, modify, or terminate this Agreement at any time if, in the opinion of its legal counsel, the Agreement is deemed to violate the terms of such law. Leavenworth County is obligated only to pay periodic payments or monthly installments under the Agreement as may lawfully be made from (a) funds budgeted and appropriated for that purpose during Leavenworth County's current budget year or (b) funds made available from any lawfully operated revenue producing source.

6. **Governing Law and Venue.** This Agreement is subject to, governed by, and construed according to the laws of the State of Kansas. Jurisdiction and venue of any suit in connection with the Agreement shall reside only in courts located in Leavenworth County, Kansas
7. **Indemnification.** TDWA shall indemnify, defend, and hold Leavenworth County harmless from and against all claims, losses, damages, or costs arising from or in any way related to TDWA's breach of the foregoing warranties. This indemnification shall not be subject to any limitations of remedies or warranties which are contained in this or any other agreement and shall survive termination of this or any other agreement between the parties hereto or thereto.
8. **Compliance with Law.** TDWA shall comply with all applicable local, state, and federal laws and regulations in carrying out this Agreement, regardless of whether those legal requirements are specifically referenced in this Agreement
9. **Modification of Agreement.** This Agreement may be modified or amended only in writing executed by both parties and will be subject to renegotiation in the event of changes to applicable law, rules, or regulations affecting the subject matter of this Agreement.
10. **Payment of Taxes.** Leavenworth County shall not be responsible for, nor indemnify the TDWA for any federal, state, or local taxes which may be imposed or levied upon the subject matter of this Agreement.

Action Requested: Approve the acceptance of the low bid by Bryan-Ohlmeier Construction for the replacement of ST-26 on Fairmont Road.

Analysis: This structure is located on Fairmont Road between 175th Street and 171st Street. This project was designed by Finney and Turnipseed and is the second bridge on Fairmont Road to be replaced in three years. This bridge has a condition rating of Poor, is structurally deficient, has SI&A Rating of 36%, and is posted at 12 tons. The existing bridge is 42' long and was constructed in 1975 by the county. The engineer's estimate for project was \$1,043,462.90. The low bid was \$1,042,209.10. This project is budgeted through the 5-year CIP with Special Highway Funds. Bryan-Ohlmeier has recently worked as a subcontractor for the wing walls of the box culvert projects on Eisenhower for MegaKC and was a subcontractor for Miles Excavating on the Basehor 155th Street Project.

There were seven plan holders on Drexel but only the one bid was received. Two contractors stated that they had already filled their books for the spring and first half of summer.

Analysis: The Board of County commissioners approved the Wellness Incentive Policy in October of 2024. The policy allows for employees to earn credits towards a reduced health care premium by completing certain wellness screenings and routine checkups. The policy currently does not address retirees who are on the County policy earning the same type of credits. This amendment will extend the coverage to retirees on the county health insurance.

STATEMENT:

The Leavenworth Board of County Commissioners (BOCC) are committed to supporting employee health and benefit programs. They recognize that employees are more likely to engage in healthy programs and remain employed with employers who offer comprehensive benefits.

Therefore, the BOCC wishes to implement the following policy.

POLICY:

Leavenworth County will offer a wellness incentive to any employee or retiree who is actively enrolled in the health insurance plan offered by the County; and who also completes and accumulates the required wellness credits and submits the required documentation during the submittal period each year.

Incentive: Employees or retirees who meet the qualifications will receive a \$50.00 monthly reduction to the current health insurance premium/cost for employee only and a \$100.00 monthly reduction in premium/cost if both the employee and spousal equivalent (adult member) are enrolled in the County health plan and both meet the qualifications. For the HDHP Individual Plan, the \$50.00 incentive will be deposited into the employee’s health savings account or in the case of a retiree reduced from the cost of the premium. The employee or retiree must earn the incentive for the spousal equivalent to be eligible to earn the incentive. The reduction in premium will begin with the pay period following when the qualifications have been met and will continue for the remainder of the current benefit plan year ending September 30.

Qualifications: To receive the incentive, employees must submit the incentive credits sheet and required documentation, to the Human Resources Department within the submittal period each year. Activities and exams must be dated within 12 months of the submittal to count as valid credits. The submittal period the 90 days after the employee or retiree becomes eligible for benefits OR the first 90 days of the new benefit year (currently October 1 – December 31). The employee and spousal equivalent must re-qualify annually to continue to receive the incentive.

Action Requested: Consideration of a request that a section of right-of-way on Brown Road Near Woodend Road and 234th Street that is unopened and unused right-of-way be vacated.

Recommendation: Approval of a Board Order (attached) vacating the right-of-way in question.

Analysis: There is a section of Brown Road near Woodend Road and 234th Street where Leavenworth County holds right-of-way access rights but has never developed.
