LEAVENWORTH COUNTY PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT

AGREEMENT FOR ENGINEERING SERVICES

THIS AGREEMENT, is between the Board of County Commissioners, Leavenworth County, Kansas (Owner) and Finney & Turnipseed, Transportation & Civil Engineering, L.L.C. (Engineer);

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Owner wishes to employ the Engineer to perform professional engineering services for the replacement of 211th Street over Tributary to Stranger Creek /County Bridge A-49. These services include providing construction inspection for steel piling, steel erection, concrete, reinforcing steel, concrete pavement, earthwork compaction, guardrail and asphalt approach roadways for the 211th Street over Tributary to Stranger Creek (the Project);

and,

WHEREAS, the Owner requires certain engineering services in connection with the Project (the Services); and,

WHEREAS, the Engineer is prepared to provide the Services;

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the promises contained in this Agreement, the Owner and Engineer agree to the following:

ARTICLE 1 - EFFECTIVE DATE

The effective date of this Agreement shall be _____

ARTICLE 2 - GOVERNING LAW

This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Kansas and the codes of Leavenworth County, Kansas.

ARTICLE 3 - SERVICES TO BE PERFORMED BY ENGINEER

Engineer shall perform the Services described in Attachment A, Scope of Services, in accordance with applicable sections of the Leavenworth County Standard Road Construction and Storm Water Drainage Standards and the Kansas Department of Transportation Standard Specifications for State Road and Bridge Construction, latest editions.

ARTICLE 4 - COMPENSATION

Owner shall pay Engineer in accordance with the Attachment B, Compensation.

ARTICLE 5 – OWNER'S RESPONSIBILITIES

Owner shall be responsible for all matters described in Attachment C, Owner's Responsibilities.

ARTICLE 6 - SUPPLEMENTAL AGREEMENTS

The provisions set forth in Attachment D, Supplemental Agreements shall be incorporated into this Agreement

ARTICLE 7 - PROJECT SCHEDULE

The provisions set forth in the Attachment E, Project Schedule shall be incorporated into this Agreement.

ARTICLE 8 - STANDARD OF CARE

Engineer shall exercise the same degree of care, skill, and diligence in the performance of Services as is ordinarily possessed and exercised by a professional engineer under similar circumstances.

ARTICLE 9 - INDEMNIFICATION AND INSURANCE

Engineer hereby agrees to indemnify and hold harmless Owner and any of its departments, divisions, agencies, officers, and employees and elected officials from all loss, damage, cost, or expenses specifically including attorneys' fees and other expenses of litigation incurred by or on behalf of the Owner and any or its officers, employees or elected officials arising out of Engineer's negligent performance of Services under this Agreement. Engineer specifically agrees that this duty to indemnify and hold harmless will apply to the following:

a. Claims, suits, or action of every kind and description when such suits or actions arise from the alleged negligent acts, errors, or omissions of the Engineer, its employees, agents, or subcontractors.

b. Injury or damages received or sustained by any party because of the negligent acts, errors, or omissions of the Engineer, its employees, agents, or subcontractors.

Engineer shall purchase and maintain during the life of this Agreement, insurance coverage which will satisfactorily insure him against claims and liabilities which arise because of the execution of this Agreement. The insurance coverages are as follows:

- (1) Commercial General Liability Insurance, with a limit of \$1,000,000 for each occurrence and \$2,000,000 in the general aggregate.
- (2) Automobile Liability Insurance, with a limit of \$1,000,000 for each accident, combined single limit for bodily injury and property damage.
- (3) Worker's Compensation Insurance and Employer's Liability Insurance, in accordance with statutory requirements, with a limit of \$500,000 for each accident.
- (4) Professional Liability Insurance, with a limit of \$1,000,000 for each claim and aggregate.

Prior to issuance of the Notice to Proceed by Owner, Engineer shall have on file with Owner certificates of insurance acceptable to Owner. Said certificates of insurance shall be filed with Owner in January of each year or may be submitted with each agreement.

Engineer shall also maintain valuable papers insurance to assure the restoration of any plans, drawings, field notes or other similar data relating to the work covered by this agreement, in the event of their loss or destruction, until such time as the work has been delivered to the Owner.

Upon completion of all Services, obligations, and duties provided for in this Agreement, or if this Agreement is terminated for any reason, the terms and conditions of this Article shall survive.

ARTICLE 10 - LIMITATIONS OF RESPONSIBILITY

Engineer shall not be responsible for: (1) construction means, methods, techniques, sequences, procedures, or safety precautions and programs in connection with the Project, (2) the failure of any contractor, subcontractor, vendor, or other Project participant, not under contract to Engineer, to fulfill contractual responsibilities to the Owner or to comply with federal, state or local laws, regulations, and codes; or (3) procuring permits, certificates, and licenses required for any construction unless such responsibilities are specifically assigned to Engineer in Attachment A, Scope of Services.

ARTICLE 11 - OPINIONS OF COST AND SCHEDULE

Since Engineer has no control over the cost of labor, materials, or equipment furnished by others, or over the resources provided by others to meet Project construction schedules, Engineer's opinion of probable construction costs and of construction schedules shall be made on the basis of experience and qualifications as a professional engineer. Engineer does not guarantee that proposals, bids, or actual Project construction costs will not vary from Engineer's cost estimates or that actual construction schedules will not vary from Engineer's projected schedules.

ARTICLE 12 - REUSE OF DOCUMENTS

All documents, including, but not limited to, drawings, specifications, and computer software prepared by Engineer pursuant to the Agreement are instruments of service in respect to the Project. They are not intended or represented to be suitable for reuse by Owner or others on extensions of the Project or on any other project. Any reuse without prior written verification or adaptation by Engineer for the specific purpose intended will be at Owner's sole risk and without liability or legal exposure to Engineer. Any verification or adaptation requested by Owner shall entitle Engineer to compensation at rates to be agreed upon by Owner and Engineer.

THIS AGREEMENT, is between the Board of County Commissioners, Leavenworth County, Kansas (Owner) and Finney & Turnipseed, Transportation & Civil Engineering, L.L.C. (Engineer);

SCOPE OF SERVICES

The project is specifically defined below:

Construction Inspection of the replacement of the 219th Street over Jarbalo Creek /County Bridge T-34.

The Engineer agrees to provide the following engineering services.

BASIC SERVICES - CONSTRUCTION

- 1. Attend the preconstruction meeting.
- Provide one full-time inspector needed for the duration of the project to observe work in progress in accordance with the contract documents and ensure that completed work will conform to the contract requirements.
- 3. The inspector shall serve as the resident representative of the Leavenworth County Public Works Department during the construction of the project.
- 4. The inspector shall maintain all required records of the system installation to include locations of facilities, project log, Contractor activities, working days, visitors, and testing in accordance with KDOT.
- Notification Process: The inspector shall maintain a log of contacts, communications, and complaints of the citizens and the Contractor initiated contacts of citizens during the construction of the project.
- 6. Reporting: The inspector shall provide a weekly report to the Project Manager on the progress and anticipated work and shall prepare a monthly pay estimate of completed work. The resident inspector shall record the results of all required testing as specified and provide drafts of all required reports to the County.
- 7. Engineer shall perform or subcontract all testing per KDOT specifications and testing frequencies.
- 8. Provide consistent oversight on the Contractor's responsibilities for traffic control and erosion control inspections.
- 9. Report to County, giving opinions and suggestions regarding defects or deficiencies in the Contractor's work.
- 10. Engineer shall provide and keep field and quantity diaries on hard cover books.
- 11. Engineer shall provide electronic as-builts in pdf format.
- 12. To accept compensation for services described in 1 through 11, Basic Services Construction in the amounts

and at such periods of time as hereinafter setforth in Attachment B.

SUPPLEMENTAL SERVICES

Any work requested by the Owner that is not included in the Basic Services will be classified as Supplemental Services. Supplemental Services shall include but are not limited to the following.

1. Changes in the general scope, extent, or character of the project or its design, including but not limited to changes in size, complexity, Owner's schedule, character of construction or method of financing; and revising previously accepted studied, reports, or design documents when such revisions are required by changes in laws, regulations, ordinances, codes, or orders enacted subsequent to the preparation of such studies/reports/documents or designs or due to any other causes beyond the Engineer's control.

Projects by Department or Category

District Court

Restored the connection of our District Court with OJA, i.e. the Odyssey application. The County and OJA arrived at a temporary compromise wherein OJA agreed to allow the County to utilize our preferred connectivity solution on a trial basis. An MOU from OJA was received and signed off on. The connection has performed reliably for the past two months and has provided the expected levels of visibility and administration that the County had hoped to achieve.

To comply with the MOU, we enabled drive encryption on District Court workstations, segmented their office on the network, created incident response documentation and implemented new password expiration policies. The password expiration policy was applied to all county departments that are not already required to meet KCJIS requirements (which are more restrictive).

OJA created a Cybersecurity Steering Committee which, among other items, was supposed to address the type of connection we had lobbied for and have temporarily been allowed to use. My participation with this committee was requested and with trepidation, I agreed to join. The committee has met twice thus far and the manner of connectivity has not proven to be a priority item. Nothing that has been said by OJA has encouraged me to believe that our current connectivity will be a permanent solution. OJA has provided a draft MOU. In its current state, I would not recommend signing.

Cybersecurity

In November of 2024, we secured a one-year subscription for cybersecurity training. The initial awareness training was completed in February. All new employees are enrolled in the training. We anticipate launching some phishing exercises this year, tempering our zeal with respect to the county employee's time and their regular duties.

Created a Security Incident Response Team (SIRT) in accordance with the documentation mentioned in the District Court segment above. This is for collaboration of key players involved with security incidents.

Researched and received a budgetary proposal for SOC (security operations center) services from 22nd Century Technologies, Inc. I had a previous budgetary proposal from another vendor from 2023 for similar services. This information was requested as we were considering applying for SLGP grant funds. No application is being submitted as the grant can only provide funding for the first year of what must be a multi-year obligation. Considering the budgetary situation, the I.S. Department is not in a position to request additional funding for SOC services in 2025.

Kansas Highway Patrol performed a KCJIS audit of Court Services. As LASO (local area security officer) for Court Services, the I.S. Department is part of the audit. Additional audits for the County Attorney's Office and the Sheriff Office are scheduled for later this year.

Website Redesign

The redesign of the county web site was "completed" in January. The process was not without incident. Several post migration problems needed to be resolved and I would have to characterise the redesign process and the vendor's performance as substandard.

Endpoint Security

Researched FortiGuard, Fortinet's endpoint security solution, as our current TrendMicro solution was at the end of its subscription in January. Ultimately decided to renew one more year with TrendMicro while we continue to consider Fortinet as a replacement solution in the future. Changing to Fortinet will likely be the goal as it will have added value considering the other Fortinet products the county currently has as well as the FortiNAC solution planned for implementation later this year.

Board of County Commissioners/Administrative Offices

Replaced the workstations, displays, etc. for the commission and administrative offices. Replaced the displays and video distribution equipment used in the commission meeting room.

Buildings and Grounds

Replaced the workstations, displays, etc.

Sheriff's Office

The Sheriff's Office had agreed to allow an audit of network traffic to/from the PSAP (public safety access point, i.e., dispatch). SecuLor was contracted to provide these services at no charge to the county. In December of 2023, we had allowed the installation of a device that would capture network traffic for the selected endpoints for a week. The device was then retrieved for analysis. As part of this process, SecuLor was to come on-site and report their findings to the Sheriff's Office I.T. and the I.S. Department. The presentation was respectable and no significant vulnerabilities were discovered. A couple of minor items were present though and we implemented the necessary changes within a few days of the presentation. These were relatively harmless items such as disabling LLMNR (link-local multicast name resolution) and NetBios over TCPIP on all county workstations. These items were not being exploited, but they are no longer of any use in an enterprise environment such as ours. Best practices dictates that when you don't need something enabled, disable it. We have disabled them.

Network Administration

Replacing the voice gateway devices necessary for analog phone service, i.e., fax machines.

Replaced the network switches at tower locations used for the wireless bridging connectivity used for remote county facilities such as the County Shop, Tonganoxie Annex, EMS Station 3 and the Transfer Station. Working with Midwest Mobile to get the firmware updated on the radio equipment deployed on the towers.

Had conduit installed to connect the network closets of the Health Department and EMS HQ at the Eisenhower facility. We intend to upgrade the connection of the two from copper wire to fiber optic cable.

1st Quarter Report

PLANNING & ZONING JOHN JACOBSON

Planning & Zoning Department News

The Planning & Zoning Department has continued to offer exceptional customer service, timely processing of applications and is continuously reviewing and offering amendments to the Zoning and Subdivision Regulations to support development in Leavenworth County.

The department has processed 12 single-family homes, in line with last year's numbers in the first quarter of 2024 and 25 accessory building permits, a slight reduction from Q1 of 2023. Additionally, the department processed 30 development cases, which includes 8 plats, plats are substantially down from 2023. Rezones are substantially higher than this time last year meaning that prospective developers are simply earlier in the development process than is typical.

As a number of policy changes are being proposed by staff that will impact specific land uses and clarify process. The tiering of SUP's and the expansion of the *Home Occupation License* will substantially decrease the overall number of active SUP's and allow a wider range of permitted uses previously restricted in the regulations.

The Department is also responsible for administration of building codes. The department has been active in the code adoption process and expects to have the 2012 Code Series ready for adoption midyear of 2024. Staff and the Building Code Appeals Board have been meeting regularly since January to establish local amendments and review specific regulations.

Staff have been working towards the completion of the annual review of 2022 Comprehensive Plan Review. Staff worked through proposed changes and additions since the beginning of the year. The annual plan review will focus on the implementation schedule progress and the development of action matrices and formation of a utilities commission.

Departmental Updates

Departmental staff have been working through case logs and developing changes to regulatory processes. The changes will allow a more thorough field review of development actions and assist current planners with case review. Staff will continue to evaluate and accommodate processes in order to provide the most efficient and comprehensive service possible.

Applications

The department is continually evaluating all permits, processes and applications for inconsistencies. Staff clarified processes, provided clear information and expectations in order to provide a better experience to developers and applicants. Staff will continue to evaluate the permits and applications to ensure the best product possible. Staff has continued to modify and further clarify our applications. In addition to updating applications for the public, Staff has worked to clarify and adopt internal policies in order to ensure that all applications are evaluated on a clear, concise and consistent basis. This is an ongoing process.

Joint Review Committee

Since instituting the Joint Review Committee with Planning, Public Works, Survey and legal departments, several policy items relative to the platting process have been identified and clarified by the corresponding department. These process changes are actively implemented where allowable and appropriate. Any substantial changes will be included in the annual policy review for consideration and potentially codification. Having these meetings in place has been a key factor in our Staff being able to continue to provide excellent customer service. In addition to the meetings, Staff continues to work with all respective departments to help facilitate a clear and common goal. Staff is often able to identify potential issues with an application prior to the application being officially submitted which has helped speed up the development process.

Development Submittal Meeting

Staff has a protocol for a development submittal meeting. This is intended to ensure that the appropriate documents are submitted upon application. In addition to staff level inter-departmental meetings, all associated departments are now participating in pre-application development submittal meetings. These meetings are intended to give the applicant more resources and answer policy questions to address respective application deficiencies before formal submittal.

In the event the appropriate documents are not provided, the application is deemed incomplete and will not be accepted.

The applicant/developer will be informed of the missing items immediately so that they can obtain the appropriate documents and resubmit. Developers are strongly encouraged to schedule a pre-application meeting prior to the deadline in order to provide time to procure any missing documents or address rudimentary regulatory concerns. Upon further review, there may be additional information needed. If so, and the requested information is not provided by the applicant, the submittal is deemed incomplete and cannot move forward for consideration by the appropriate board or commission.

Regulation Updates

Staff has been active in recommending a number of changes and or clarifications in policy for 2024. A number of text amendments will be presented to the Planning Commission in April. These changes are a result of the annual policy review.

A general annual review of policy occurs at the planning commission level then is forwarded to the BOCC in the first quarter of each year. Policy review is a critical component of administration to verify that the adopted regulations are commensurate with the vision of the comprehensive plan and the intent of the governing body.

Comprehensive Plan

Although all areas of the current plan have been evaluated for consistency and considered in the annual review, a focus on plan implementation and the development of action matrices have been established as primary goals.

Committees

Planning and Zoning Staff are members of numerous committees, primarily committees spearheaded by the Mid-America Regional Council and the Kansas Department of Transportation. Participation in these committees helps ensure Leavenworth County is up-to-date with funding opportunities, planning initiatives and plan making which may affect Leavenworth County.

Building Codes Appeals Board

This group while serving in its primary function as an appeals board, also serves as an advisory committee to the Board of County Commissioners. The board is in the midst of a new code adoption process. Ideally, a code review is a 4-6-month process. After this review, any local amendments and code body will be sent to the BOCC for review, consideration and finally adoption.

Active Transportation Programming Committee (ATPC)

The Active Transportation Programming Committee oversees federal programs that provide funds to sponsors of transportation projects that benefit pedestrians, bicyclists and other non-motorized transportation users. The committee assists in reviewing project applications and provides recommendations to the Total Transportation Policy Committee (TTPC), Air Quality Forum and MARC Board of Directors. The committee also assists in monitoring and reporting on the progress of funded projects.

Bicycle-Pedestrian Advisory Committee

The Bicycle-Pedestrian Advisory Committee (BPAC) is a regional forum that is briefed on bicycle and pedestrian matters in the Kansas City area. It is one of MARC's planning modal committees that advises the Total Transportation Policy Committee and contributes to MARC's bicycle/pedestrian planning efforts. BPAC also serves an advisory role on certain funding and programming activities administered through the MPO processes.

Sustainable Places Policy Committee

The Sustainable Places Policy Committee provides leadership and policy advice to MARC's Board of Directors in regional sustainable development. Under the guidance of the SPPC, MARC works with local communities to update and implement land-use strategies that support transportation, equity, environment and conservation principles.

Air Quality Forum

The Air Quality Forum is a policy committee comprised of local elected officials, air quality and transportation agency personnel, and business and community group representatives. The Forum reviews regional air quality issues and makes policy recommendations regarding those issues to the MARC Board of Directors and the states of Kansas and Missouri. There are 31 seats on the Forum. Local governments occupy 21 seats, four are held by state air and transportation agencies, three by business and economic development concerns, and three are designated for health and environmental groups.

Planning Commission

The Planning Commission meets on the second Wednesday of each month to hear development cases. Typically, these cases include Special Use Permits, Plats and Rezoning requests. The Planning

Commission is tasked with hearing development cases, and providing a recommendation to the Board of County Commissioners. The Planning Commission also holds work sessions periodically in order to assist staff in amending regulations or to have study sessions to review relevant case law. Staff has begun holding work sessions with the Planning Commission to provide education and guidance for new Commissioners.

Work Sessions

Work Sessions with the BOCC are held regularly. Staff also holds work sessions with the Planning Commission.

Development

Development in the County is trending generally static in the Q1 from 2023 numbers for new Single-Family Homes and new accessory structures. While no one can make a viable prediction of eventual new construction performance due to variable market conditions, the number of rezoning's and tract splits in the last quarter of 2023 indicate a probable rise in plat development actions (buildable lots) in Leavenworth County in 2024. The number of Special Use Permits and variances have continued to decrease. The overall numbers are listed below:

GIS Department Quarterly Performance

The Leavenworth County GIS department is dedicated to providing precise, up-to-date, and comprehensive maps and geospatial data to assist the county and its residents. We ensure weekly updates to all data, which are promptly accessible via the county's <u>launched website</u>. Additionally, our commitment extends to daily updates on the <u>Integrity website</u>, along with the creation of new data in <u>PDF</u>, <u>shapefile format</u>, and <u>CAD</u>, all provided at no cost.

Accomplishments from the End of December 2023 to present

- ✓ All public GIS layers have undergone updates to 2024 on our <u>GIS web map</u> and <u>ArcGIS HUB</u>. These updates encompass shapefiles and PDFs, enabling easy access and utilization for anyone with an internet connection.
- ✓ Updated the <u>Single-Family Residential building permit</u> web map for the Planning and Zoning Department and added all permits that were issued in the last three months.
- ✓ Updated the maps on the election website of the Clerk's office.
- ✓ Developed a 3D visualization model for traffic counts in Leavenworth County for the years 2022-2023.
- Created a slope map for the Planning and Zoning Department, specifically addressing areas (Sensitive Land) with slopes exceeding 10 percent.
- ✓ Updated all businesses throughout the entire county, including those within the city limits. As a result, we now have approximately 1390 businesses.
- Created a web map for the Planning and Zoning and the Appraiser's Department, focusing on zip codes to serve as a reference during the updating process for each zip code.
- Updated primary and secondary contacts in our cemetery database and forwarded the changes to Tylor at SAM for updating on our integrity website.



- ✓ Twenty (20) track splits/combinations/boundary line adjustments were made to the appraisal property database.
