The Board returned to regular session at 10:05 a.m. no action was taken and no decisions were made. The subject was limited to the legal interests of the County.

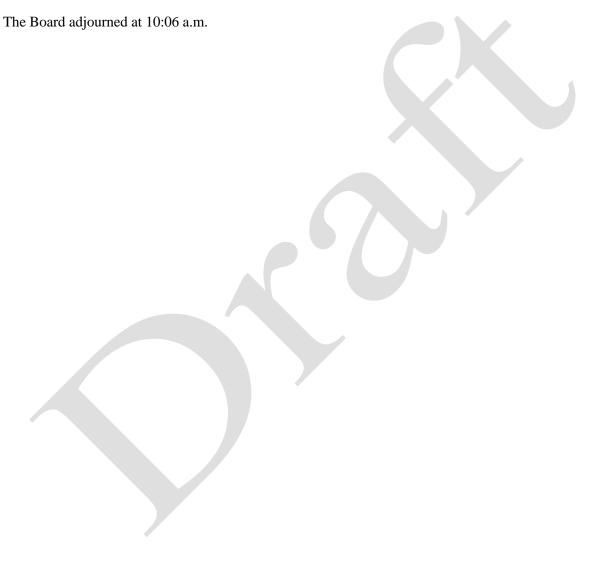

Projects

A. 158th Street Road Improvement Project – MHS 2004 Design – Linaweaver Construction

i. ATT has obtained their R/W permit and materials to relocate the line under K-32 that they failed to move when they were notified 6 months ago. Contractor clearing and grubbing from sta 15+00 to 60+00 (It & rt). Contractor began work on Storm line 01 until phone line was encountered in construction area that conflicts with box location. Contractor moved north to work on other pipe crossings until phone can be moved. Perimeter erosion control was placed on the project south of Metro Ave. Fencing sub was onsite to remove existing fencing. No work on 3/30/22 due to weather. SWPPP inspection completed on 3/31/22. Next SWPPP will be 4/14/22 barring a rain event The water district is working to relocate water line crossing that were not the responsibility of the county.

B. K-45 Bridge Replacement Project - Watershed Institute 50/50 grant cost share

- i. The upstream on Millwood Road culvert replacement was completed and approved by the WaterShed Institute engineer. This was a replacement of a 114" Culvert.
- ii. Norfolk Crane has completed the removal of the existing structure. Grading is ongoing.
- iii. Project Schedule:

July 15, 2021 – Early Start Date
June 15, 2022 – Final Completion required by date

C. Bridge HP-19 - Wilson Design - Ebert Construction - Finney and Turnipseed Inspection

- Pre-Construction meeting has been held. Anticipated start date is May 2nd. 230 Calendar Day Project. Which requires the project to be completed this year.
- ii. The contractor has requested to be paid for stored materials (steel). They were told this was not the county's accepted practice.

D. Bridge Replacement Designs (A-49, E-18, F-46, T-34) – Benesch These projects are being pushed to completion so that we can build as many as possible with ARPA funds.

- i. A-49 Plans are complete. Right-of-Way and easement exhibits have been mailed to property owners, 2 of 4 have returned signed paperwork. Benesch is identifying utility conflicts and coordinating utility relocation – possible ATT & Atmos conflicts
- ii. **T-34** Final review completed & provided to Benesch. No Utility status provided. Right-of-Way and easement exhibits have been mailed to property owners, 1/4 have returned signed paperwork. One landowner believes the project will tear out his lateral field. Digger Jim could locate the lateral line in question but did find other lines that are not in conflict. I met with the property owner and took pictures. We will need to be aware of the possible conflict during construction.
- iii. F-46 Dondlinger Construction MHS Inspection

iv. E-18 Dondlinger Construction - MHS Inspection

The preconstruction meeting will be held on April 8th. Dondlinger has notified the county that they plan on closing the road on April 18th and start demolition of the existing bridge.

E. ST-100 Bridge Replacement Project – Off-System Bridge Program

- i. Finney and Turnipseed have completed the Field Check Plans and are on schedule for the bridge's KDOT letting.
- ii. Per KDOT's project schedule, the project's construction should start in March 2023.

F. E-48 Bridge Replacement Project – Local Bridge Grant Program

- i. BoCC accepted the KDOT grant for \$150,000. The contract with KDOT was approved.
- ii. Husker Steel provided a pre-bid cost estimate sheet. They priced the project at \$195,000. This does not allow us to accept their pricing at this time. We will have to go through the full advertisement and bidding process.
- iii. KDOT issued final funding windows this past week. In their notice they extended the construction window until November of 2023.

G. Tonganoxie Road HRRR Safety Improvement Project – MHS design/inspection

- i. 90/10 cost share grant High Risk Rural Roads Program
- ii. MHS has been working on the field survey for this project. They have found that the old road improvement plans from the construction of existing roadway, that are from an old KDOT project, shows right-of-way locations that are not consistent with recorded records. MHS has rescinded their request for additional time. They may bring it back forward in the future but they have remaining billable hours and I encouraged them to continue their design and track the hours prior to submitting supplemental requests.

H. Regional Transportation Capital Improvement Plan and Study:

The amended agreement is now in the process of being approved by the city councils.

I. KDOT Local Projects

i. 106 C-4790-03 Local Road Safety Plan

i. TranSystems notified us that they are going to mail the county a copy of our draft plan that needs to be reviewed and have comments returned. We reached out to TranSystems as they are now a year behind and they said they may have it next few months. At the KDOT regional meeting in Holton I asked when we should expect our safety plan because it is a year behind schedule. KDOT responded that they would look into the matter and thought they were done. I will provide a copy to the board when I receive one.

ii. HRRR Call for Projects -

i. We were notified that our application for a second phase of safety improvements to Tonganoxie Road north of Stranger Creek was not approved.

iii. KDOT Transit Grant -

i. We were successful with one of our three applications and were awarded \$525,000 towards a parking lot improvement.

iv. Kansas Cost-Share Program -

i. I wrote and submitted an application for funding for County Route 30 on 3/8/2022. Award notifications should be sent out near the end of April.

v. KDOT Local Bridge Program - 2021 -

i. Received a grant to cost share the replacement of E-48.

J. Federal Grant Applications

- BASE Grant KDOC Met with Tom and he submitted our application for the grant. KDOC has now notified everyone the announcements for the grant recipients has now been delayed from March 26th.
- ii. **RAISE Grant** The KCATA, BoCC, and MARC letters of support that I was responsible for getting to KDOT have all been sent. The City of Leavenworth has requested that aesthetic improvements be added to the application. The current design is a plain interstate bridge similar to that on I-435 over the Missouri River.

K. Other Outstanding Projects / Items





DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS

- i. We notified KDHE that all clean up completed through their funding on Oak Mills will be contracted and not performed by county staff. KDHE is working with the railroad to get permission to work along the railroad to complete the necessary cleanup. Currently they are working to get Union Pacific to wave their \$2,000 right-of-way work permit since they are responsible for the trash within their right-of-way. They are also trying to get a meeting set with UP reps on site to ask for them to cover a portion of the cost after they actually view the severity of the problem.
- ii. Traffic Counts Traffic Counts have started again for the 2022 year.

Surveying

Training is ongoing for the Survey Technician under my license. He is going to start the KCKCC Land Surveyor Certification education next quarter which is the minimum education level accepted with 8 years of experience to become licensed.

We are still advertising for a County Surveyor or a qualified County Surveyor Assistant. Over the past 12 months we have had no qualified applicants for the County Surveyor position. I recently researched the position again on Indeed and found that there are multiple survey manager positions being advertised between \$125,000-\$140,000/yearly.

<u>Planning and Zoning - Engineering and Survey Reviews</u>

Billing for Olsson's serves has continue to be maintained at or below budgetary levels. Reviews on all subdivision plats have continued to be well within the 10 day review window.

Fleet Management

We have continued to bid items for next year's delivery. Lead times are really long on most machinery. We are continuously working to swab out our old fleet with Enterprise vehicles and install cameras and GPS equipment.

GIS Department

The Leavenworth County GIS department is working hard to update all data on a weekly basis to the county's newly <u>released website</u>. Also, update the <u>Integrity</u> website on a daily basis. The department has also updated all data and even created new data from scratch, which is available free of charge in <u>PDF</u>, <u>shapefile format</u>, and <u>CAD</u>.
