

## **Threat made at DMV results in charges, sentencing**

LEAVENWORTH, Kan. --- A Lansing man who threatened an employee at a DMV has been sentenced.

Dennis J. Brockenshire, 62, was at the Leavenworth DMV on the morning of August 9, 2022. While there, according to witnesses, Brockenshire became upset and made a verbal threat while inside the DMV building.

The DMV, following Brockenshire's threat, eventually closed the office for the rest of the day.

**Leavenworth County Attorney, Todd Thompson said, "We all know how people can get frustrated at the DMV, but there's never a reason to lose your cool."**

On March 24, 2023, Brockenshire pleaded no contest to a disorderly conduct charge after waving his right to a trial. Brockenshire was sentenced to 30 days in jail, but the court suspended that sentence and granted supervised probation for a period of 12 months
