

Man sentenced to 12 months for Walmart LEGO theft

LEAVENWORTH, Kan. — Clinton V. Dubray, 32, of Parsons, Kansas, was sentenced Wednesday, May 21, 2025, to 12 months in the Leavenworth County Jail on a charge of theft related to a December 2023 incident at a local Walmart where Dubray stole LEGO toys.

The charge stems from an incident on Dec. 11, 2023, in which Dubray entered the Leavenworth store and took LEGO merchandise valued at \$1,852 without permission or payment. According to investigators, Dubray was accompanied by another man who distracted a Walmart employee near the exit while Dubray left the premises with the unpaid merchandise.

Dubray was later identified and charged with theft. Following today's sentencing hearing, he was sentenced to 12 months in the county jail.

"Theft is a serious offense, no matter the item. Crimes involving Lego sets may seem minor, but they stack up quickly. Those who build these schemes will face consequences," said Leavenworth County Attorney Todd Thompson.
