LEAVENWORTH, Kan. --- A 22-year-old Leavenworth man has been sentenced to prison on charges related to dealing drugs, interfering with a death investigation, and arson.

On Wednesday, Oct. 2, 2024, a judge sentenced 22-year-old Marvellis Armon Miller to **73 months for Count I** Unlawful Distribution of Marijuana, **12 months for Count II** Arson, **8 months for Count III** Obstructing Apprehension or Prosecution, **8 months for Count IV** Criminal Possession of a Weapon by a Felon, **6 months for Count V** Interference with Law Enforcement, and **6 months for Count VI** Unlawful Distribution of Counterfeit Controlled Substance. The sentences in each count are to run consecutively to each other for a total sentence of **113 months**.

On Aug. 23, 2024, Miller appeared with his attorney and pleaded **no contest** to the amended complaint as charged. The Court accepted the plea and found Miller guilty.

Leavenworth County Attorney Todd Thompson said, "This case was complicated and involved multiple law enforcement agencies working together. These are serious offenses. Our law enforcement partners worked tirelessly on this investigation, and I thank them all."
