Leavenworth man found guilty of indecent solicitation of a child

LEAVENWORTH, Kan. --- On July 12, 2024, a Leavenworth County jury found Nicholas Thomas Fuller, 36, guilty of Indecent Solicitation of a Child.

According to court documents, Leavenworth police officers responded to a home near Muncie Road and Shrine Park Road on Aug. 20, 2022, after a juvenile called 911, reporting they had been sexually assaulted and needed help. Once contact was made with the victim on the scene, the victim told officers that Fuller had molested him inside a home and that it had happened several times before. The victim told officers that Fuller sat on his chest and asked for oral sex.

Leavenworth County Attorney Todd Thompson said, "We appreciate all who were involved in this case. We know it takes courage to make a report, and even more so, having to testify. A jury gets to determine these verdicts, and we appreciate their service. Our office will always work to protect the innocent and ensure that justice is served."

During Friday's hearing, Fuller was acquitted of three counts of aggravated criminal sodomy and one count of aggravated indecent liberties with a child. Fuller pleaded not guilty to all charges on Nov. 18, 2022.

A sentencing hearing is scheduled for Sep. 4 at 11 a.m.
