LEAVENWORTH, Kan. --- A Leavenworth man with a prior conviction for aggravated assault with a deadly weapon and a history of failing to comply with Kansas Offender Registration requirements has been sentenced for making a criminal threat involving a deadly weapon.

On Friday, Nov. 1, 2024, 27-year-old **Noah Sanchez** was sentenced again for having a firearm. On Dec. 8, 2023, Sanchez was upset when he went to the victim's home around 2:50 a.m. and began pounding on her door. When the victim refused to open it, Sanchez, while holding a gun, threatened to "shoot up" her apartment, placing her in fear that he would seriously harm or kill her. Sanchez received a 14-month sentence to be served consecutively to his existing sentence.

Leavenworth County Attorney Todd Thompson said, "We are grateful no one was hurt. We hope when someone is done with their criminal sentence, they have actually learned. Unfortunately, that was not the case here. The Offender Registration Act can only go so far to protect our community and help those on the list not to offend again."
