LEAVENWORTH, Kan. --- Torin Michael Baughman, 19, of Lansing, Kansas, has been charged with First Degree Murder, or in the alternative Distribution of a Controlled Substance Causing Death – to wit, fentanyl, and Aggravated Endangering a Child. The charges stem from the January 17, 2023, death of N.C.B. (DOB: x/x/2007), a 15-year-old Leavenworth County teen.

Baughman was arrested by Leavenworth County Sheriff's Office deputies on March 20, 2024, after the Kansas Bureau of Investigation (KBI) secured an arrest warrant for Baughman.

"We appreciate all the agencies who contributed to this investigation, including the KBI and the Leavenworth County authorities; no one ever gave up," said Leavenworth County Attorney Todd Thompson.

Torin Michael Baughman should be presumed innocent until proven guilty.
