LEAVENWORTH, KAN. --- A Leavenworth man will serve 60 days in jail, followed by 18 months of supervised probation, for possessing meth just outside of the Leavenworth Justice Center.

Trent L. Belcher, 31, was arrested on October 6, 2022, after a Leavenworth County Deputy working security at the Justice Center was informed that Belcher had defecated on the sidewalk and rubbed it on the walls of the Community Corrections building. Belcher was arrested about five blocks north of the Justice Center; while taking Belcher into custody, officers found a crystal-like substance believed to be methamphetamine in Belcher's possession. That substance later tested positive for meth.

Belcher pleaded guilty to unlawful possession of a controlled substance on June 23, 2023. Belcher received his sentence earlier today.

Leavenworth County Attorney Todd Thompson said, "Our officers are often faced with unique and difficult situations. I want to thank our law enforcement officers for their hard work."
